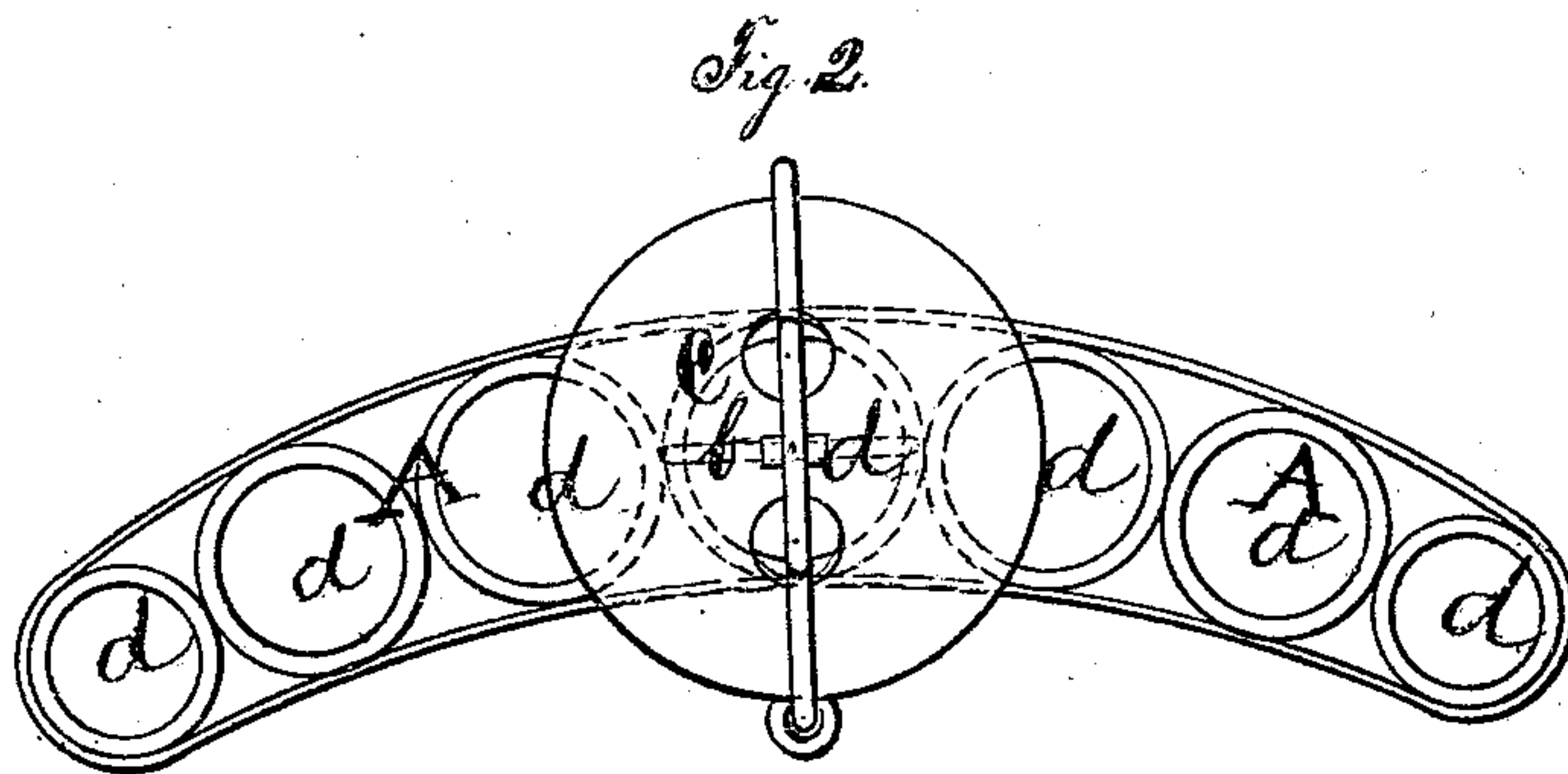
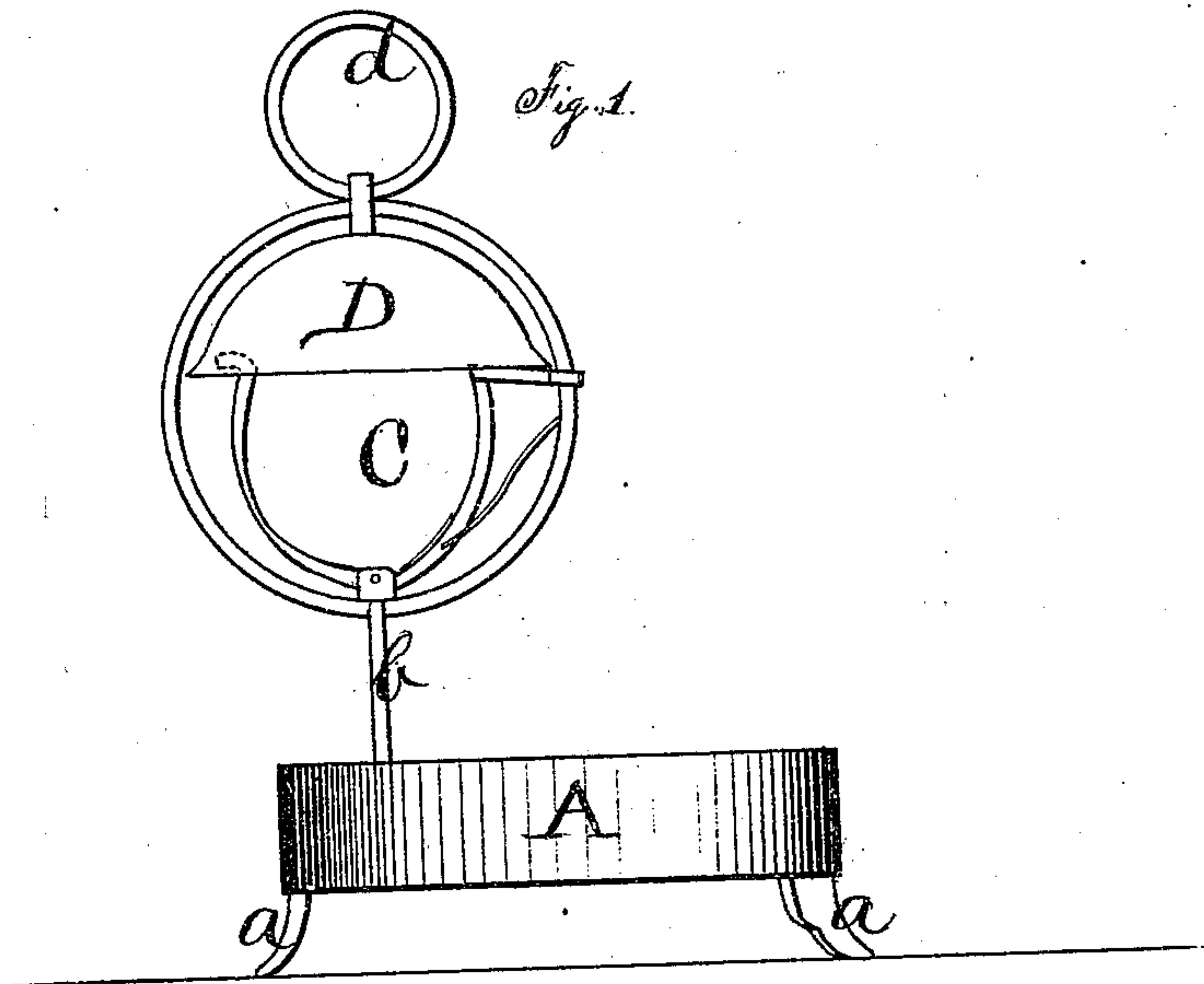

## IMPROVED RACK FOR SUGAR, CREAM, SALT, &c.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

### *To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, MARY ANN S. MULLIN, of Osgood, in the county of Ripley, and State of Indiana, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Individual Racks; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, which form a part of this specification, and in which—

Figure 1 represents an end view, and

Figure 2, a plan view of my individual rack.

Similar letters indicate like parts in both figures.

The nature of my invention consists in the employment of a semicircular rack, designed to hold sugar, cream, salt, and all kinds of seasonings, and to which is attached an alarm-bell, all of which will be hereinafter fully described.

To enable others skilled in the art to which my invention appertains, to make and use the same, I will now describe its construction and operation.

In the accompanying drawings—

A represents a semicircular rack, provided with legs

*a a*, and with receptacles *d d*, for receiving sugar, cream, and all kinds of seasonings, as seen in fig. 2.

*b* is a semicircular wire, secured to the centre of the rack. To the centre of this wire is attached the ring C, in which is secured the alarm-bell D.

Above the alarm-bell is secured the handle *d*.

A rack is intended to be placed before each individual seated at the table, thereby doing away with the trouble of waiting for a waiter.

Having described my invention,

What I claim as a new article of manufacture, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The semicircular rack A, provided with receptacles *d d d*, and ring C, in which is attached the alarm-bell D, all constructed to operate substantially as specified.
