

IMPROVEMENT IN HORSE-RAKE TEETH.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, I. L. Bartlett and J. B. L. Bartlett, of North Jay, in the county of Franklin, and State of Maine, have invented a new and valuable Improvement in Horse-Rake Head and Tooth; and we do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the construction and operation of the same, reference being had to the annexed drawings, making a part of this specification, and to the letters and figures of reference marked thereon.

Figure 1, of the drawings, is a side view of our in-

vention.

Figure 2 is a top view of the same.

Our invention relates to horse hay-rakes; and It consists in the novel construction of a rake-tooth adapted thereto.

Our rake-tooth is constructed of strong elastic wire, bent in a coil, as shown at A, and also bent forward, in the manner shown at B, of the drawings.

Our rake-tooth is also bent outward, as shown at

C, and has a hook adapted for attachment to the rakehead, as shown at D

The letter E represents a brace, firmly united to the main tooth, and has a hook at its upper end, corresponding in all respects with the hook D, and forming, in conjunction with the part C', strong braces, to prevent the tooth from turning or bending sidewise.

What we claim as our invention, and desire to se-

cure by Letters Patent, is—

The rake-tooth herein described, having coil A, bent portions B and C, lateral brace E, and hooks D, constructed and arranged as specified.
