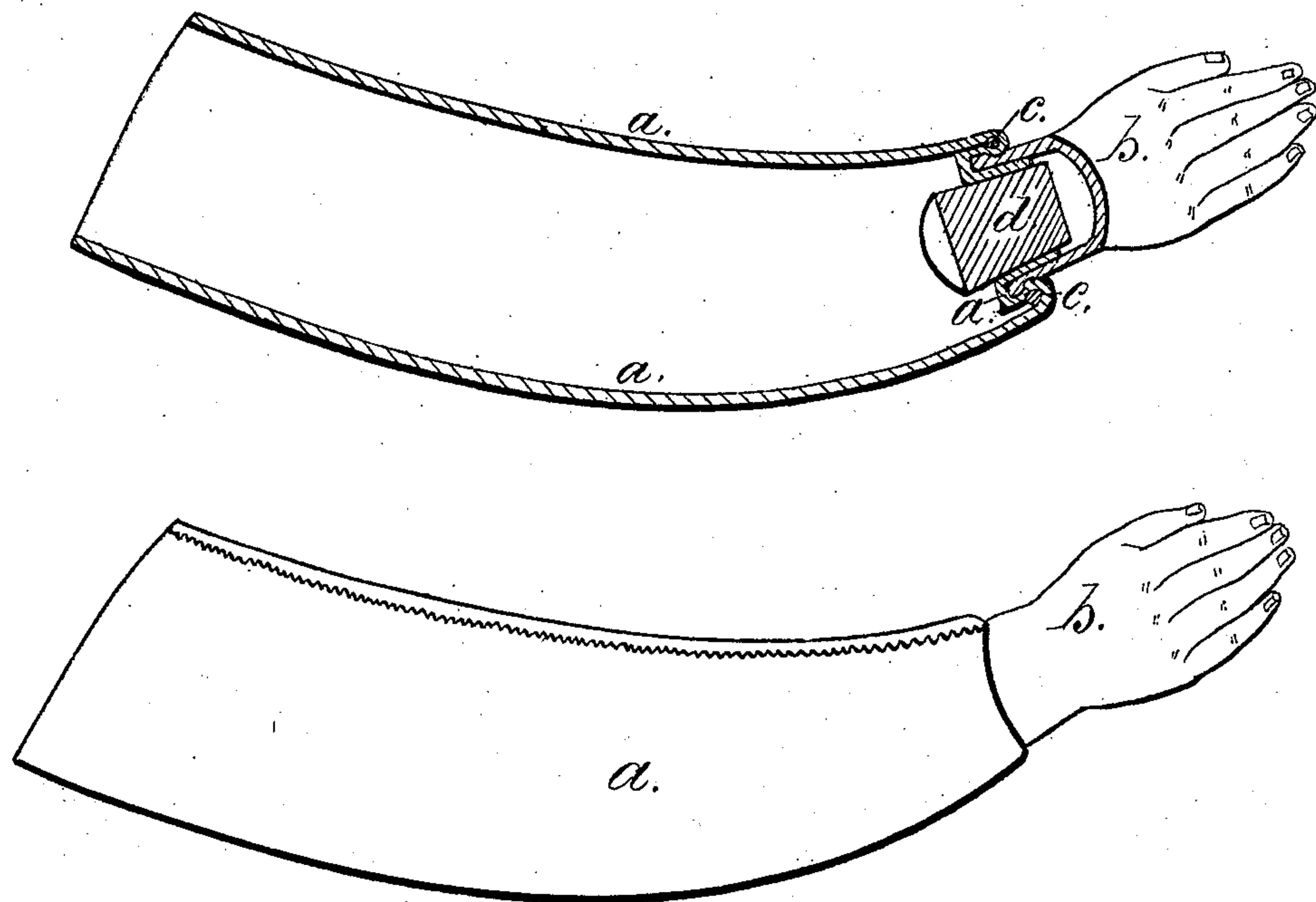

IMPROVEMENT IN DOLLS.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MARTIN KINTZBACH, doll-maker, residing at No. 2237 Germantown avenue, in the city of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have invented an Improved Manner of Fastening the Hands of Dolls into the Arms of the same.

A neat porcelain hand, the wrist part hollow, is introduced into a leather bag, in the form of an arm, and so that a small edging protrudes over the wrist-end of the hand. The leather arm, around the wrist, is then securely tied, and the raw edge of the leather turned within the hollow of the wrist, and there se-

cured with a cork, well glued. (See drawing I.) As soon as the glue is sufficiently dry, the leather arm is turned inside out, and well stuffed. It appears as in drawing II.

The improvement I claim as my invention, is—

The “fastening the leather arm to the porcelain hand, by means substantially as shown and described.”
