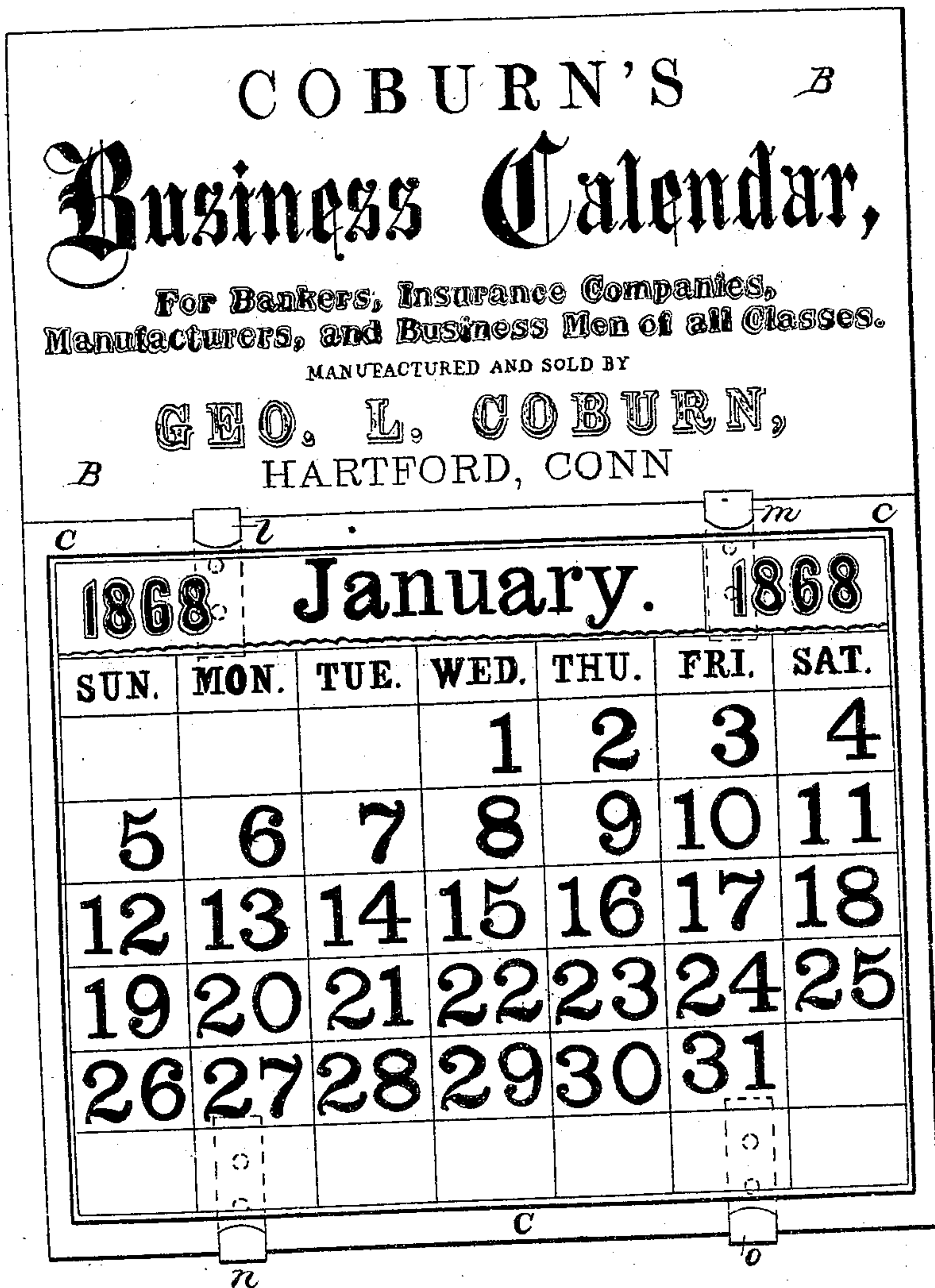

IMPROVEMENT IN CALENDARS.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE L. COBURN, of Hartford, in the county of Hartford, and State of Connecticut, have invented an Improved Business-Calendar; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon.

Figure 1 shows a front view of the improved calendar.

Figure 2 shows a section of the same, through the clips *l* and *n*.

My invention consists in making a calendar of a number of removable cards, *C*, containing a table of the days of the week and month, arranged in the usual manner, which cards are attached to the back *B*, by means of the metallic clips *l m n o*.

These clips, which are secured to the back *B*, by rivets, or any other common mechanical device, hold the cards *C*, so long as they are needed.

When the month has expired, the card can be easily removed, by slipping it out sidewise, which exposes the next in order.

These cards can be printed upon opposite sides, making six for the twelve months in one year. In this case, when one month, as January, has expired, the card is slipped out, and then returned to its place with its other side out, on which is printed a calendar for the next month.

The back *B* can have any appropriate heading, as shown in the drawings.

Claim.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The removable calendar-card *C*, in combination with the permanent back *B*, and clips *l m n o*, when the several parts are arranged and constructed with reference to each other, substantially as and for the purpose described.
