IMPROVED LINIMENT FOR THE TREATMENT OF NEURALGIA, RHEUMATISM, &c.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

I, BENJAMIN BISSELL, of New London, in the county of Oneida, State of New York, have invented a certain compound, called Magnetic Balm, for the cure of neuralgia, rheumatism, swellings, cuts, and bruises, which I claim to be an improvement upon anything of the kind that has ever before been invented or used.

The nature of my invention consists in mixing the following ingredients, viz:

One ounce of oil of peppermint;
One ounce of oil of spearmint;
Two ounces of pulverized ginger;
One ounce of African cayenne pepper;
One ounce of oil of cinnamon;
One ounce of origanum;

One quart of alcohol; and
One quart of best proof whiskey.
Bottle these; shake well, and let stand ten days;
then use.

Claim.

I claim, as my invention—
The manufacture of a compound, which I denominate "Magnetic Balm," of the ingredients, in the proportions, and for the purposes set forth, as above.
