IMPROVED MEDICAL COMPOUND.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HORACE H. GRIGG, of the city and county of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and useful Medical Compound; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same.

My compound is intended as an injection for acute and chronic urethritis, and consists of about two (2) grains of tartrate of iron and potassa, twelve (12) grains of permanganate of potassa, two (2) grains of tannic acid, and six (6) ounces of water.

The relative proportions of the ingredients can be

varied, to apply to different cases, those given being founded on actual experience.

I claim the within-described ingredients, mixed or compounded in about the proportions set forth, substantially as and for the purpose specified.
