



IMPROVEMENT IN CAPS FOR COFFIN-NAILS.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, STEPHEN A. BARKER, of the city and county of Providence, in the State of Rhode Island, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Coffin-Trimmings; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the annexed drawings, making a part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective view of a coffin-trimming,

with my improvement attached.

Figure 2 represents the same when opened, or with cap turned off.

Figure 3 represents another pattern, with the same improvement attached.

In the accompanying drawing—

d and e, fig. 1, represent a well-known coffin-trimming; d, the face-plate, and e, the cap or cover. d is made with a countersunk hole for a screw, the common way of fastening, as shown in fig. 2.

One side of the cap or cover, e, is connected to plate d by the pivot or pin b, so it can be turned,

fig. 2.

On the opposite side of e, fig. 2, is formed the notched lip a, for the purpose of locking e to the stud e, as shown in figs. 1 and 3.

To use my invention, the cap e being flexible when turned to cover the centre of plate d, the notch in lip a is sprung and clasped to stud c, thus locking the cap e to its place.

The advantage of my invention is, the notched lip a can be used on any-shape cap, as in turning the cap e, it describes a circle, the pivot b as the centre. The lip a is made a suitable width from the plane of cap e, on which it is formed, to avoid the interfering of a corner with the stud c, which interference would occur if it were not so arranged.

I desire it to be distinctly understood that my invention relates wholly to the mode of attaching the ornamental screw-cap to the main plate.

I therefore claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The improvement in ornamental coffin-trimmings herein described, which consists in providing the screw-cap with a notched lip a, arranged to spring vertically into holding-contact with the stud c upon the main plate, for the purpose specified.
