



IMPROVEMENT IN PICTURE ENVELOPES.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ROBERT PRICE, of New York, in the county of New York, in the State of New York, have invented a new and improved Combination Picture and Letter Envelope.

I am aware that an envelope or picture-frame with an opening in it is not new, but said envelopes or picture-frames cannot be sent by mail without the addition of an extra letter envelope to inclose said picture.

Now, my improvement has for its object the combination of the letter and picture envelope in one, and without the addition of an extra envelope when said picture is to be mailed, thereby making a neat and

useful article, and at the same time saving much expense, and is constructed as follows:

A is an opening to show the picture.

B is the cover that covers the picture.

C is the gummed sealing flap.

I claim the combination of a picture and letter envelope in one, as described and shown in the drawing, for the purposes described.
