

## IMPROVEMENT IN CALENDARS

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same

I, Joshua F. Tannatt, of Springfield, Hampden county, Commonwealth of Massachusetts, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Calendars, of which the following is a specification.

My improvement relates to that form of calendars in which slips are used having the calendar for each months printed sengrately.

month printed separately; and My invention consists in arranging a ca

My invention consists in arranging a card to receive the slips by cutting and raising up parts of the card so as to form a case for the reception of the slips K.

The construction of my-invention I will now describe, referring to the accompanying drawing.

In order to form a case for the reception of the slips, I cut in the card II to which they are to be attached, and which may be suitably printed, the openings A B C, and raise up slightly the parts D E F of the card.

The slips K, having monthly calendars printed on them, are then inserted in the case formed by these raised parts D F F, and one can be removed whenever the month runs out, leaving the next month exposed.

If desired, the calendars for two different months may be printed on the same slip, one month on one side and the other month on the other side, and the slip turned when desired to change from one month to another.

Other minor variations may be made in the arrangement of the slips, and the printing on the same and on the card.

By this means I form a simple, cheap, and convenient calendar.

The card H is usually formed of paper, but may be formed of tin or other convenient material.

I claim the case for receiving calendar-slips, formed by cutting and striking up the parts D E F of the card H, substantially as shown and described.
