IMPROVEMENT IN CONCRETE PAVEMENTS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 102,097, dated April 19, 1870.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, NELSON H. Downs, of Birmingham, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Improvement in Concrete Pavement; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same.

This invention relates to an improvement in concrete pavements for walks, roads, &c., and consists in the combination of gravel,

ashes, tar, and guano.

I prepare the compound by mixing three parts gravel, one part ashes, one part coal or wood tar, and then to this compound I add

in the proportion of one half pint of guano, a little more or less, to the square yard of surface to be covered.

The effect of the guano is to dry and harden the material, and, by practical test, I find it serves a better purpose than any material known to me.

I claim as my invention—

A concrete pavement consisting of the materials and in the proportions substantially as described.
