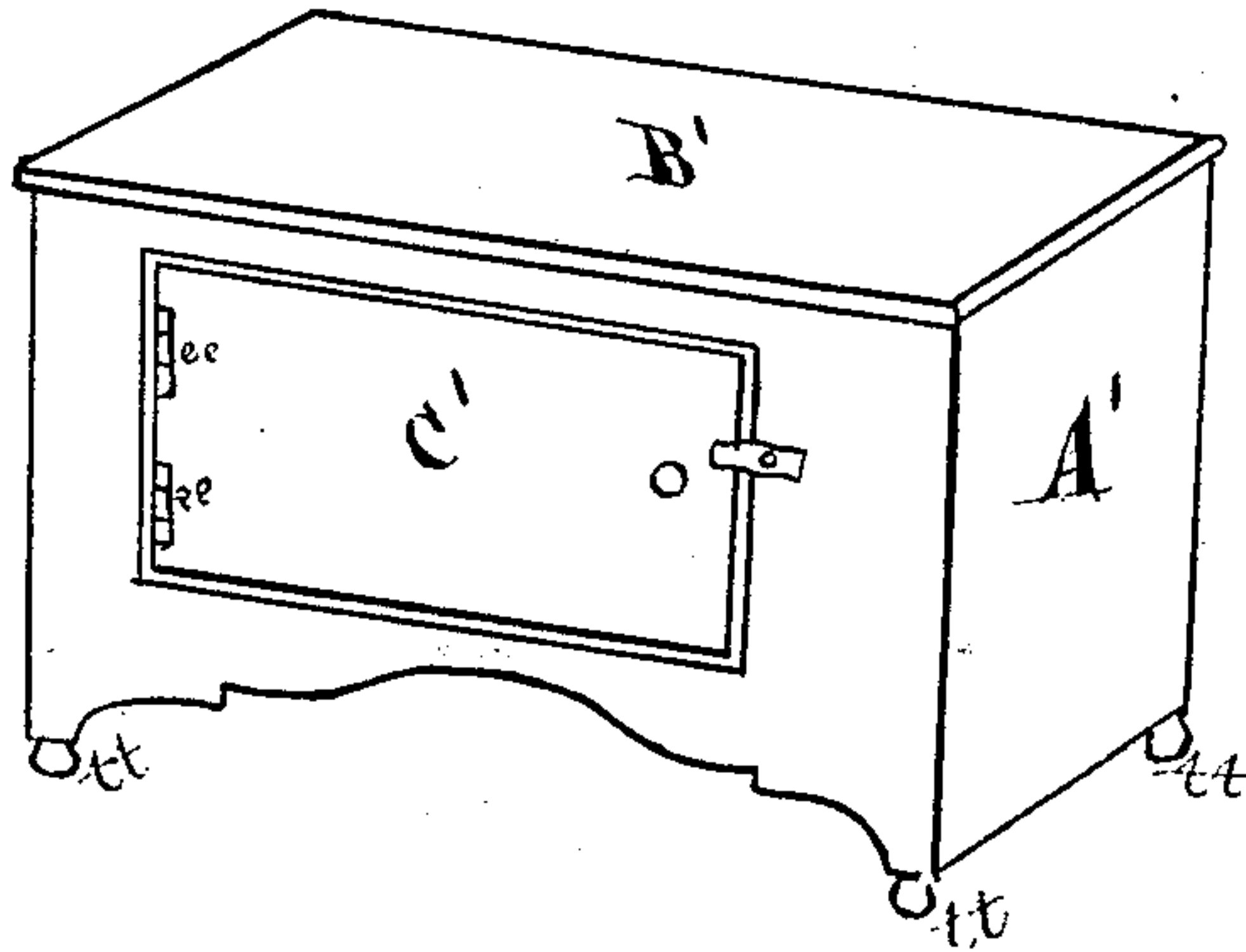
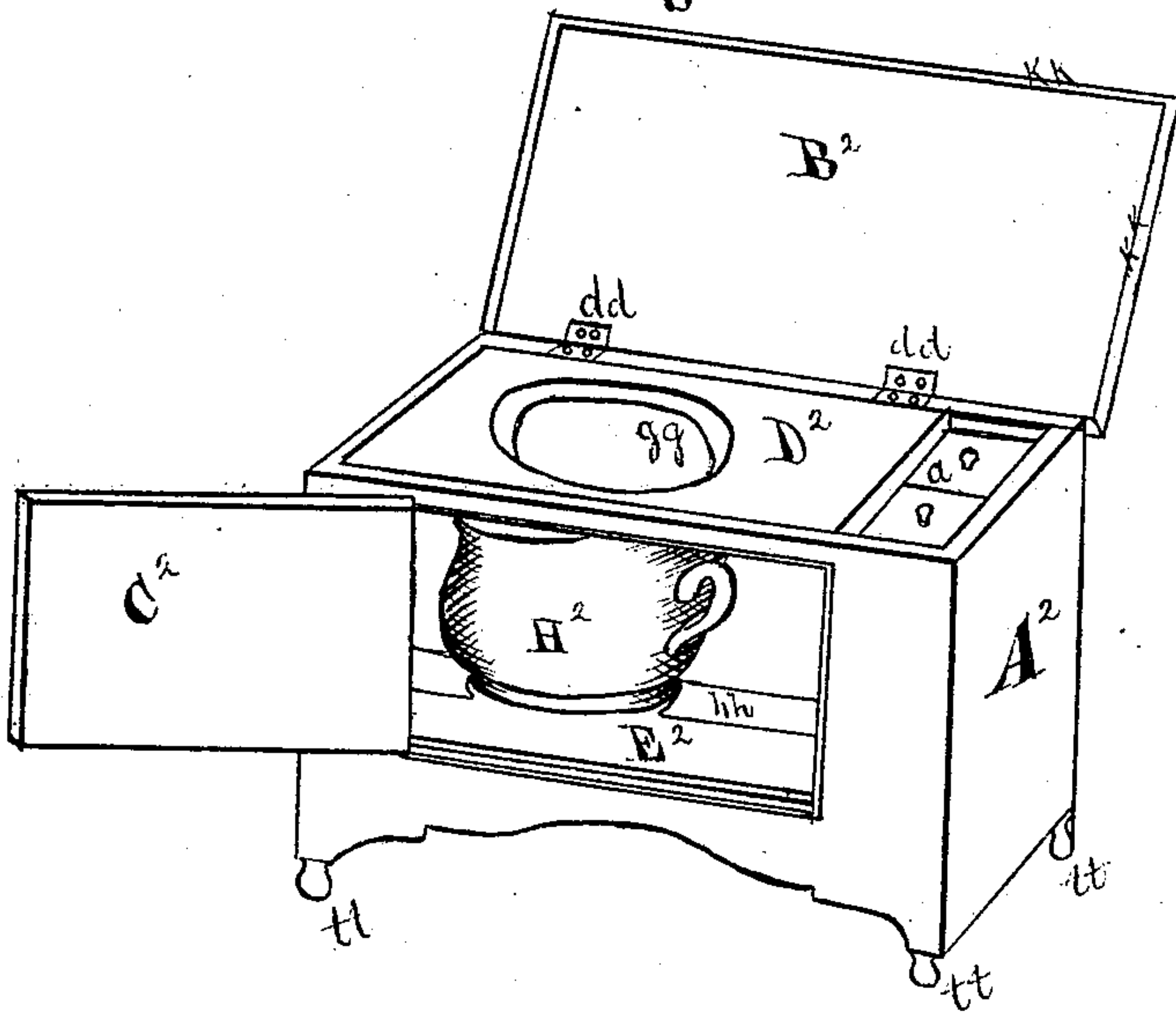

IMPROVED CRICKET AND COMMODE.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, JOSEPH C. KNOWLES, of New Bedford, in the county of Bristol and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new and useful "Cricket and Comode Combined;" and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing and to the letters of reference marked thereon.

Figure 1 is a perspective view of my invention as it appears when used as a "cricket."

Figure 2 is an interior view of my invention showing the interior arrangements as a "comode."

Fig. 1, A¹ is the body of "cricket and comode combined" resting on knobs or casters *t t*.

B¹ is the lid, upholstered on top to form the cricket.

C¹ is the door, hung by hinges *e e*.

Fig. 2. A², is the body of "cricket and comode combined," resting on knobs or casters *t t*.

B² is the lid, hung by hinges *d d*, with rims or flanges K K overlapping the body A².

C² is the door by which the chamber H² is removed.

D² is the seat, with hole *g g* directly over chamber H².

E² is the bottom of cricket and comode combined, on which rests chamber H².

h h is a nest fastened to bottom E² which holds the chamber H² in its proper position.

a is a till or locker in side of body A², for holding a syringe or other articles.

In this invention I do not claim any device previously invented or patented for a cricket and comode; but

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A cricket and comode, A¹, constructed with the hinged lid B¹, having the projecting flanges K K, door C², seat D², bottom E, nest *h h*, and till *a*, all constructed and arranged as and for the purpose described.
