

IMPROVEMENT IN LAMP-SHADE SUPPORTERS.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

I, EDWARD W. HOLT, of Corinna, in the county of Penobscot and State of Maine, have invented certain Improvements in Lamp-Shades, of which the following is a specification.

Nature and Object of the Invention.

My invention has for its object to furnish a neat, simple, and effective lamp-shade, which shall be so constructed and arranged that it may be readily adjusted and supported at any desired height.

Description of the Accompanying Drawings.

Figure 1 is a perspective view of the lamp-shade. Figure 2 is a view of the clasp spring.

General Description.

A is the screen or fender, which may be made of paper or any other suitable material.

Near the upper edge of the screen A is attached the strip D; to this, at the middle of the screen, is at-

tached the wire spring B, which is U-shaped in form, and has formed on one side the ring E, and is bent on the other side opposite the middle of the ring E, from the ring, as shown in figs. 1 and 2.

By this construction, the spring B will clasp itself upon one side of a lamp-chimney, and slide thereon, to adjust the shade at various heights.

The ring E serves as a brace upon the inside of the chimney, to keep the shade from canting sideways.

Claim.

I claim a clasp spring, B, having formed on one side the ring E, and bent on the other side opposite the middle of the ring E, from the ring, as herein shown and described, and for the purpose set forth.
