

## IMPROVEMENT IN SCAFFOLD-BRACKET.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Joseph M. Taylor, of Dublin, in the county of Wayne and in the State of Indiana, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Scaffold-Brackets; and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing and to the letters of reference marked thereon making a part of this specification.

The nature of my invention consists in the construction and arrangement of a "scaffold-bracket" to be used on an inclined plane, such as roofing, &c.

In order to enable others skilled in the art to which my invention appertains to make and use the same, I will now proceed to describe its construction and operation, referring to the annexed drawing, in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective view of my bracket when used for shingling, or any other like purpose, and

Figure 2 is a side view, showing its position when used for the purpose of holding shingles or any other bodies used in the construction of roofing, or such like purposes.

A represents an iron bracket of three legs, toothed at their ends, as shown in fig. 1.

Near the joint of the three legs is pivoted a forked adjustable bar, B, with clutches C C for the purpose of holding a scaffold-board.

At the outer end of the bar B is also a tooth to fasten on the roof, and said bar may be adjusted to any pitch of roof by changing the pivot.

Having thus fully described my invention,

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The three-legged bracket A, in combination with the adjustable bar B, provided with clutches C C, and their ends toothed, all substantially as and for the purposes herein set forth.
