


IMPROVEMENT IN ATTACHING SPONGE-HOLDERS TO TABLES, &c.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Cornelius S. See, of New Brunswick, in the county of Middlesex and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Attaching Sponge and Chalk-Holders; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawing forming part of this specification.

My invention relates to devices employed to hold chalk or sponge on the side of desks or tables, and consists in an improvement thereon, which will be more particularly specified hereinafter.

Figure 1 is a sectional elevation of a part of a table, and my improved arrangement of attaching devices; and

Figure 2 is a plan of the same, the table being shown in dotted lines in both cases.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding

parts.

A is the cup-holder, consisting of a plate of metal, preferably cast-iron, of suitable length and breadth,

with a slot in one end for the reception of the shank B of the cup C, and having two or more screw-holes, D, one of which passes through the slotted end, so that the screw will form the pivot of the shank of the cup, and both screws serve to hold the holder A to the table in a very permanent manner, and much better than in the common way, where one screw only is used, without the holder A, and screwing directly into the wood after passing through the hole in the shank.

Having thus described my invention,

I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

As a new article of manufacture, a chalk-holder, combining the cup C, having shank B thereon, with the slotted plate A, perforated for two screws, as shown and described.
