IMPROVED MEDICAL COMPOUND.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same

I, EDWARD MYERS, of Davis, in the county of Stephenson and State of Illinois, have invented a new and useful Medical Compound, of which the following is a specification.

Nature and Objects of the Invention.

The nature of my invention relates to a medical compound for the cure of rheumatism, neuralgia, headache, tooth-ache, ear-ache, diphtheria, cramps, colic, diarrhea, cholera-morbus, sprains, bruises, chilblains, &c.; and

The invention consists of the following ingredients, in about the proportions specified:

Two quarts ninety-eight per cent. alcohol, two ounces tincture capsicum, two ounces tincture catechu, two ounces tincture guaici, two ounces tincture opium, two ounces oil hemlock, two ounces oil origanum, two ounces oil sassafras, two ounces oil wintergreen, two ounces chloroform.

My method of preparing the mixture is as follows:
I first put all of the tinctures and oils together in a clean bottle. I next pour on the alcohol, and agitate until the oils are cut, and all thoroughly mixed. I then pass it all through a filter, being careful to shake well.

The preparation is then ready for use, and may be used internally or externally, and will be found a valuable remedy, not only in the diseases enumerated, but also in many others of a similar character.

Claims.

What I claim as my invention is—

The medical compound, consisting of the ingredients, in the proportions and for the purpose set forth.
