## IMPROVEMENT IN FEVER AND AGUE MEDICINE.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Samuel Laighton, of Newark, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and improved Fever Medicine; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to make and use the same.

This invention relates to a new compound for curing fever and ague in all its various forms, especially that produced by miasmatic exhalations.

The invention consists in compounding the following ingredients, in about the proportions set forth:

Thirty grains of quinine; thirty grains of aloes, finely powdered; fifteen grains of rhubarb, finely

powdered; fifteen grains of cream tartar; one pint of best Holland gin.

These ingredients are well mixed and stirred in a cold state.

One wineglassful is to be taken three times a day before meals.

Having thus described my invention,

I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—
