


TOY MONEY-BOX.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 105,645, dated July 26, 1870.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, John H. Chappel, of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Combined Toy Money-Box and Whistle; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 is a central section of my improved money-box and whistle. Fig. 2 is a side view

of the same.

Similar letters of reference indicate corre-

sponding parts.

My invention has for its object to furnish a simple and substantial toy for children, which will serve as a toy ball to roll about, as a toy money-box or savings-bank, as a toy whistle, and which, when it contains some money, will serve as a rattle; and it consists in the toy constructed as hereinafter more fully described.

The box or toy is made in the form of a ball or globe, and is made in two parts or hemis-

pheres, A B, struck up out of sheet metal, of suitable thickness, and the edges of which are soldered securely to each other. In the center of one part, as A, is formed a slit, a', of such a length and breadth as to allow pieces of money to be slipped into the box through the said slit a'. In the center of the other part or hemisphere, B, is formed a small round hole, b', and to its inner surface, around the hole b', is soldered the edge of a struck-up piece, C, of sheet metal, having a small hole, c', formed in its center, as shown in Fig. 1, thus forming the whistle.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The combined ball or spherical toy money-box and whistle A a' B b' C c', constructed substantially as herein shown and described, and for the purposes set forth.
