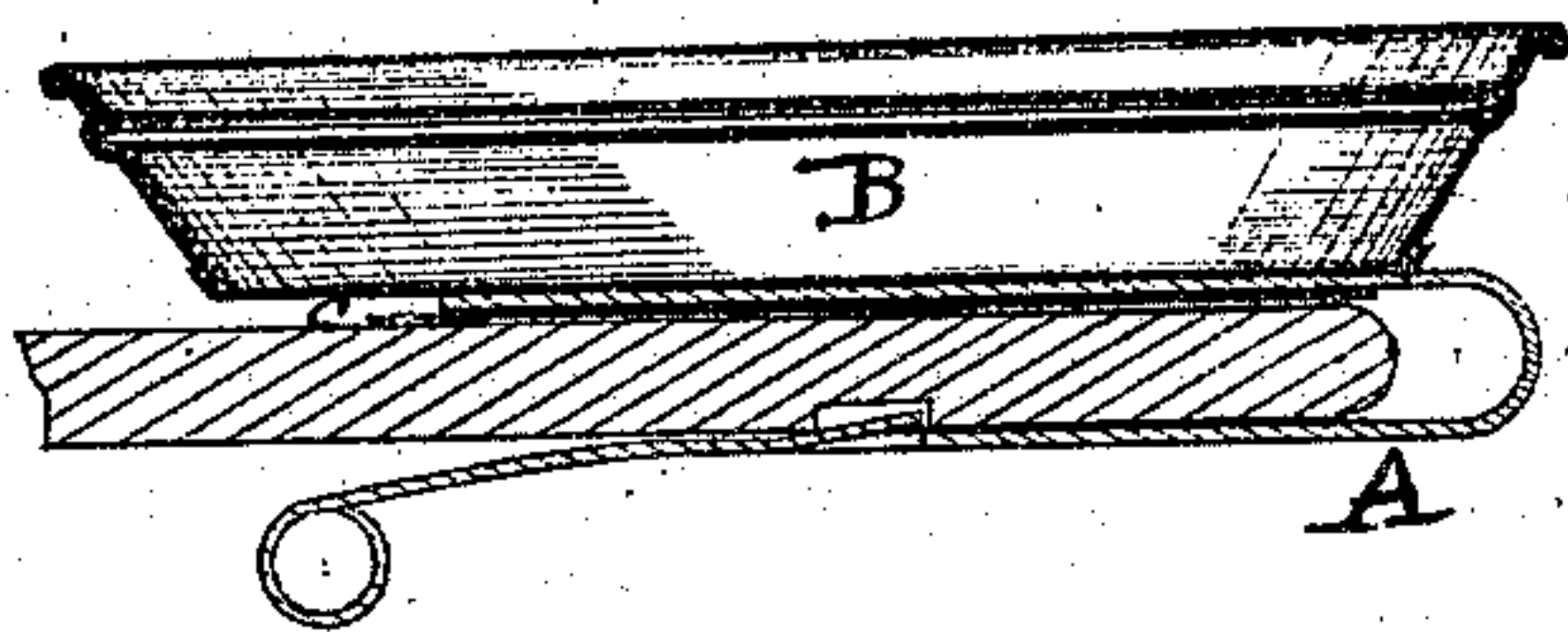
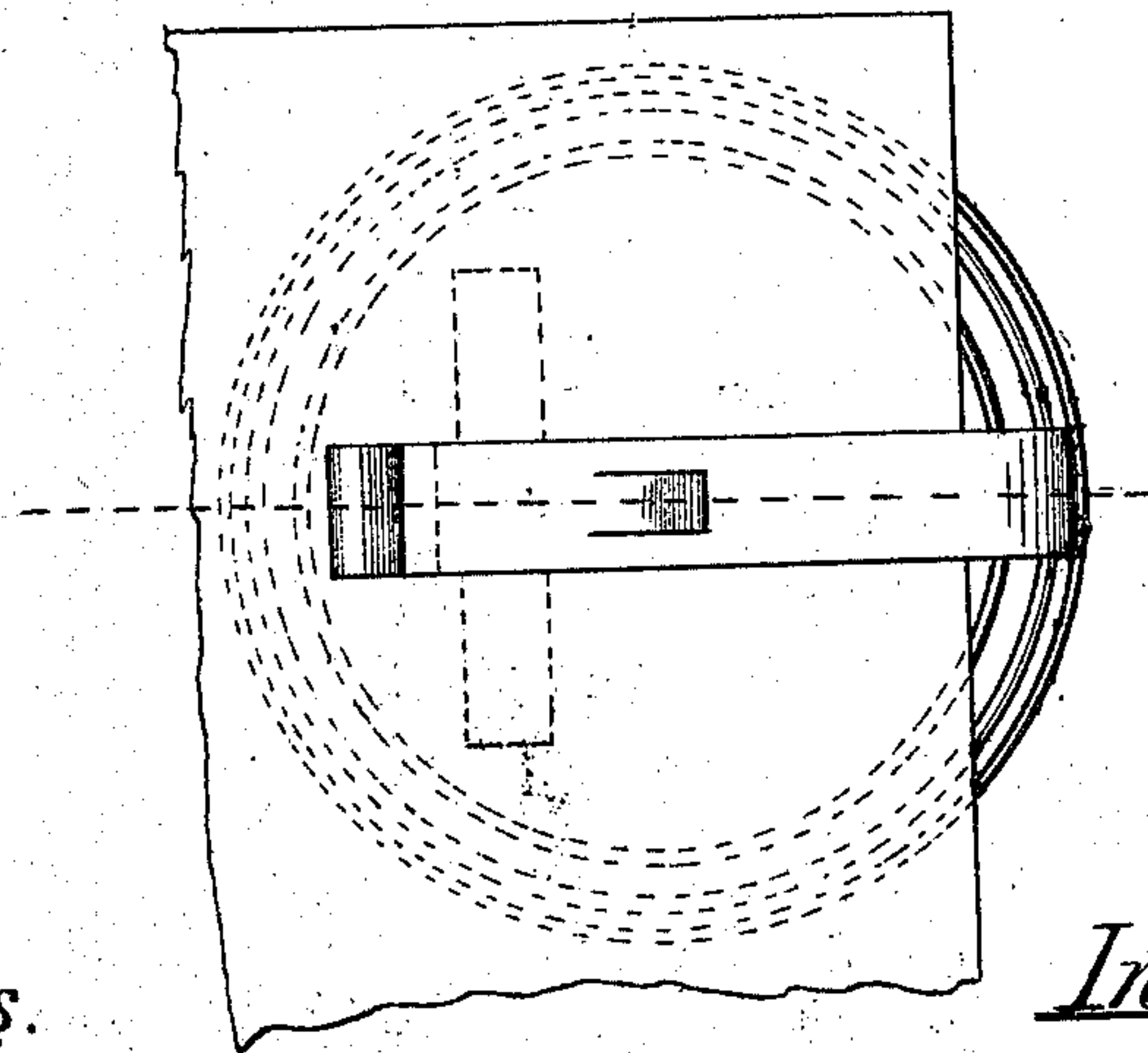

IMPROVEMENT IN DISH-FASTENER.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, CHRISTIAN-R. FREET, of the town of Upper Strasburg, in the county of Franklin and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and useful Device for Fastening a Child's Dish or Plate to the Table; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing and to the letters of reference marked thereon, in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective view, and

Figure 2 a plan or bottom view of the fastening device.

My invention consists in a dish or plate-fastening, as will be hereinafter more fully described.

This fastening, A, is attached to the dish or plate B by sliding into a slotted piece of tin or copper, c, that is fast to the dish, so that it can be detached when to be washed or scoured, made in the form of a clamp, so that it can be placed over the edge of the

table-top or leaf, and fasten in a notch underneath the same, either a spring within itself to hold it fast, or made stiff so that it cannot spring, having in it a thumb-screw, C, or an attached spring to the stiff clamp, to hold it to the table.

I am aware of the patent of Gould and Harris, dated September 8, 1868, and such I do not wish to claim; but

What I do claim as my improvement, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The plate B, provided with the slotted piece C, of tin or copper, in combination with the removable fastening A, constructed as herein shown and described, and for the purpose specified.
