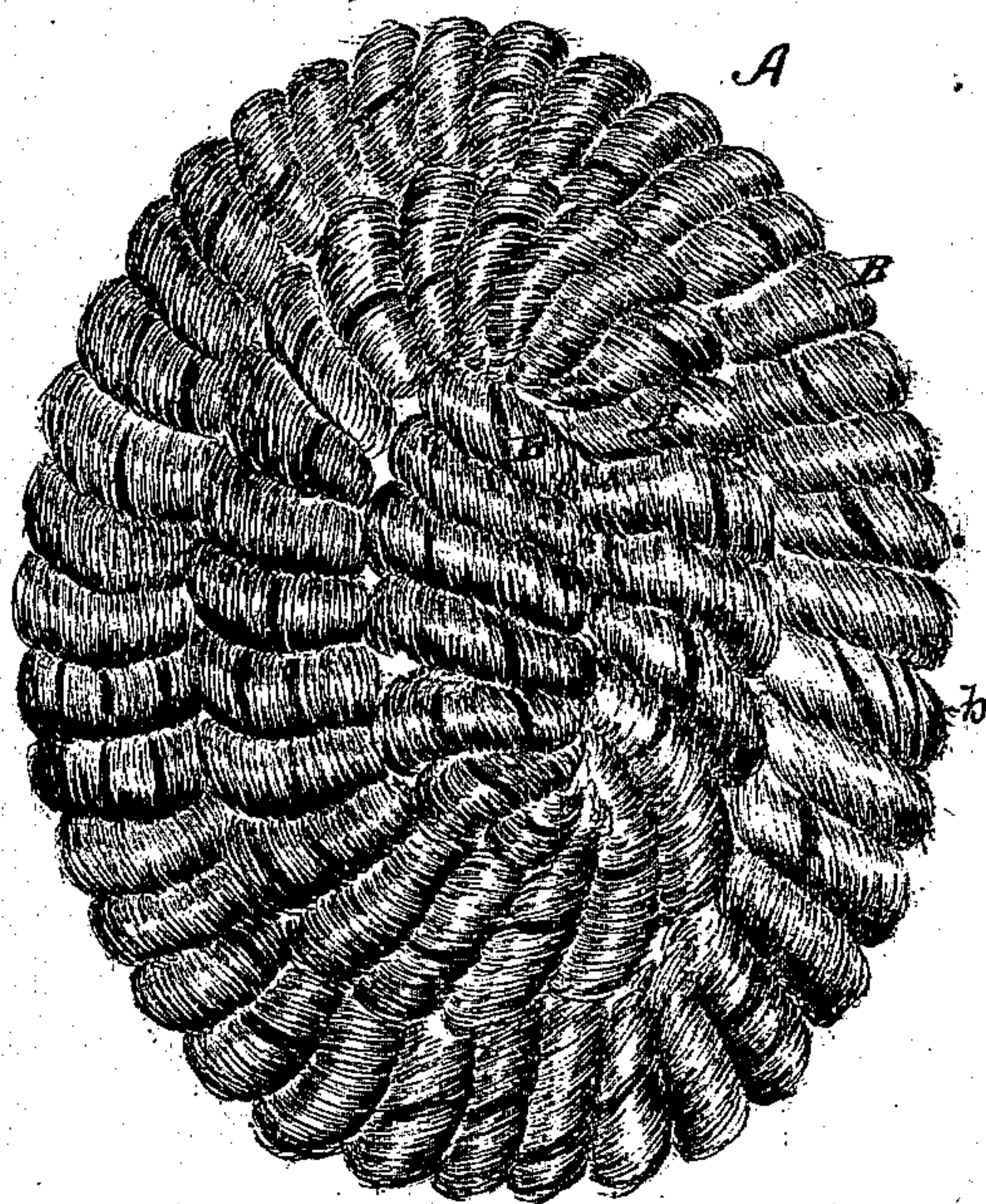
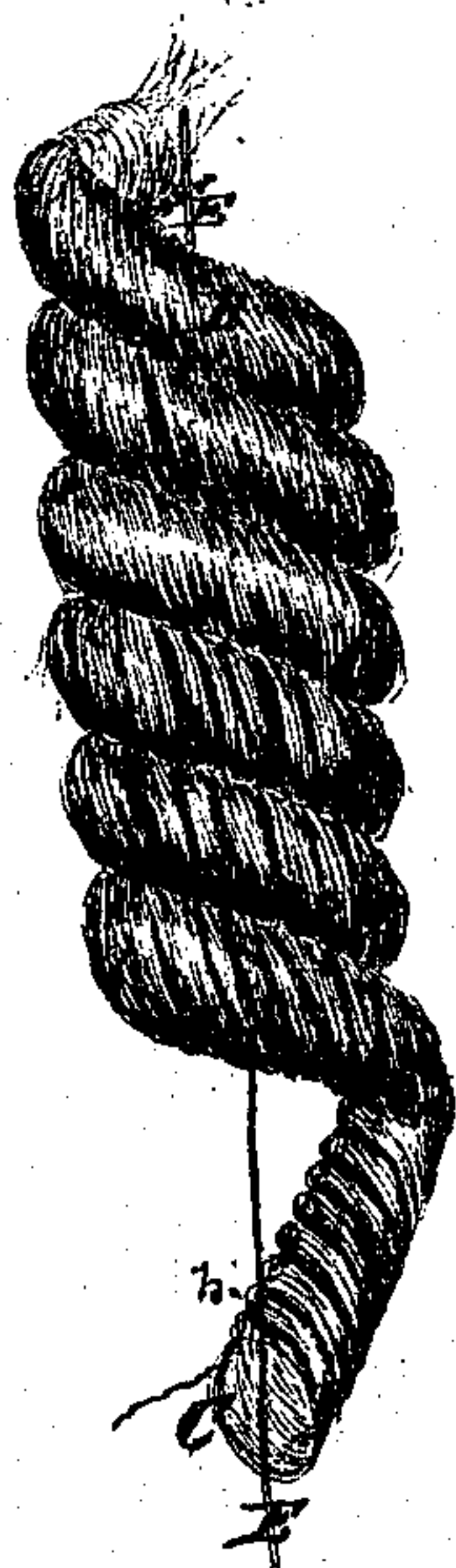

MOSES M. COHEN, OF BOSTON, MASSACHUSETTS.

IMPROVEMENT IN CHIGNONS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **105,914**, dated August 2, 1870.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MOSES M. COHEN, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented certain Improvements in Chignons, which I call the Neapolitan Frizzle, of which the following is a specification.

Figure 1 is a view of my improved chignon, and Fig. 2 a view of a portion of the same.

This invention consists in a chignon composed of a tube made up of a series of circular links or loops of hair, jute, or other material of which chignons may be manufactured, woven together, which tube is then wound around a stiff wire, cord, or the like that may be bent so as to form a chignon of any desired shape or size.

In the drawings, A, Fig. 1, is the chignon, the manufactured article; B, the tube of which the chignon is composed; *b*, the rings, which are woven together, so as to form the tube, as

shown at C, and E the wire around which the tube is wound.

It will be readily seen that by this method chignons can be more quickly and easily manufactured, and also that the design can be varied, and the tubes of hair can be arranged in any tasteful and convenient form.

Having thus fully described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A chignon composed of the tube B, wound around the wire E when the tube is made up of rings *b*, woven together, substantially as described.
