IMPROVEMENT IN MEDICAL COMPOUND FOR THE CURE OF GRAVEL.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THEODOR G. EISWALD, of the city and county of Providence, in the State of Rhode Island, have invented a new and useful Medical Compound, for the Cure of Gravel and the Relief of Fits and Convulsions attendant thereon.

My invention consists of a new and valuable medical compound, composed of well-known chemicals, in combination with the juice of beets, substantially in the following proportions:

One (1) ounce bromide of potassium; four (4) ounces raw beet-juice; thirty (30) drops buchu; four (4) drops tincture of opium.

These ingredients are to be well compounded with about two ounces of water.

For bromide the iodide of potassium may be sub-

stituted with similar results, although the former is preferred by me.

The beet-juice may be extracted from any kind of beets, although I greatly prefer the red.

The doses should not greatly exceed a tea-spoonful three times a day, before eating.

Having thus described my invention,

I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The within-described medical compound, composed of the ingredients substantially in the proportions specified.
