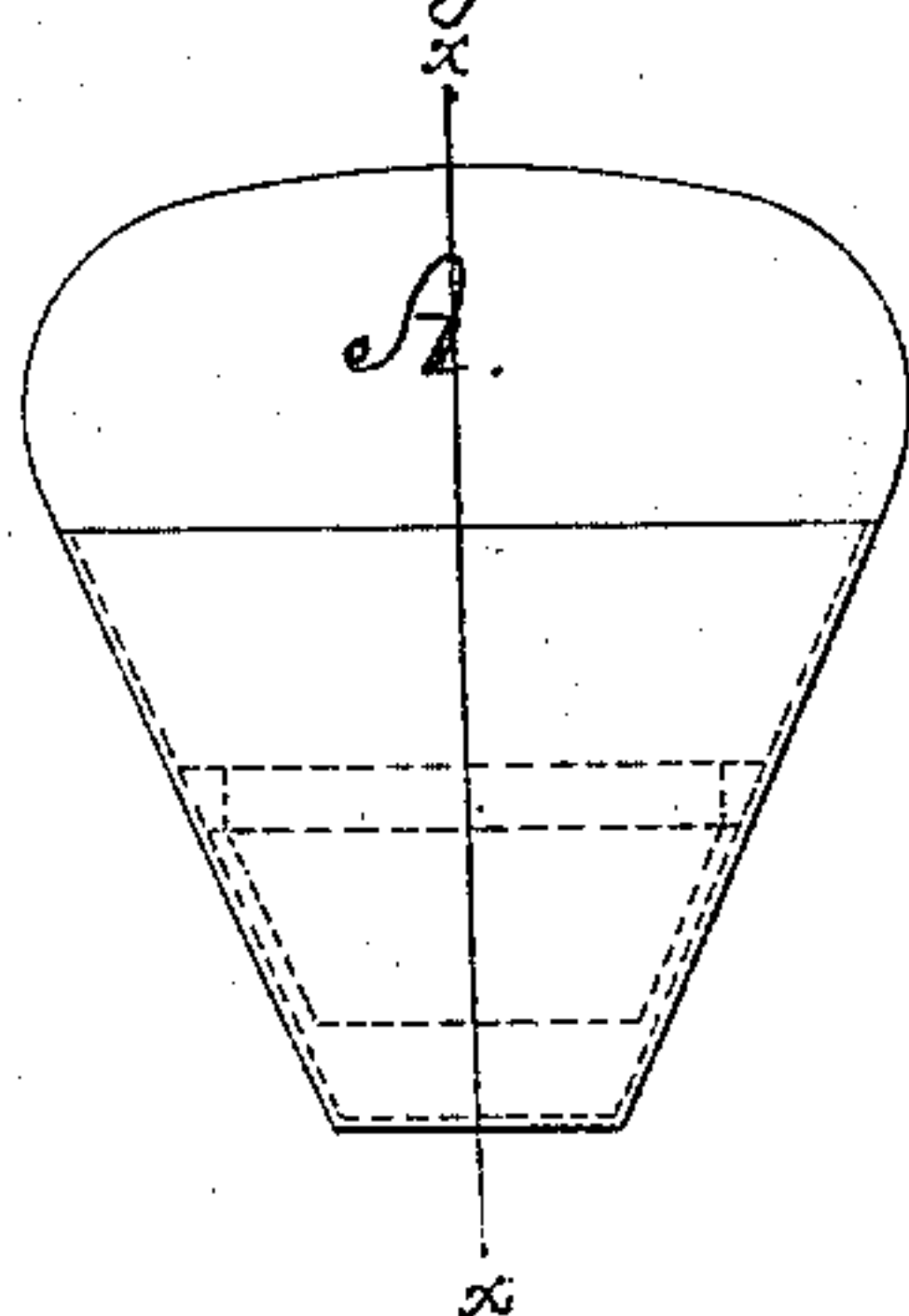

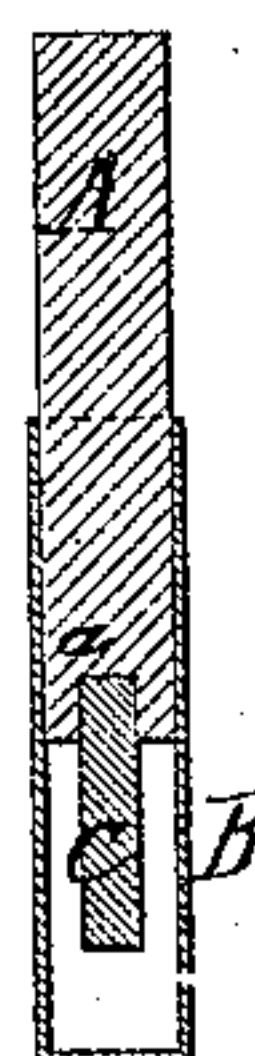

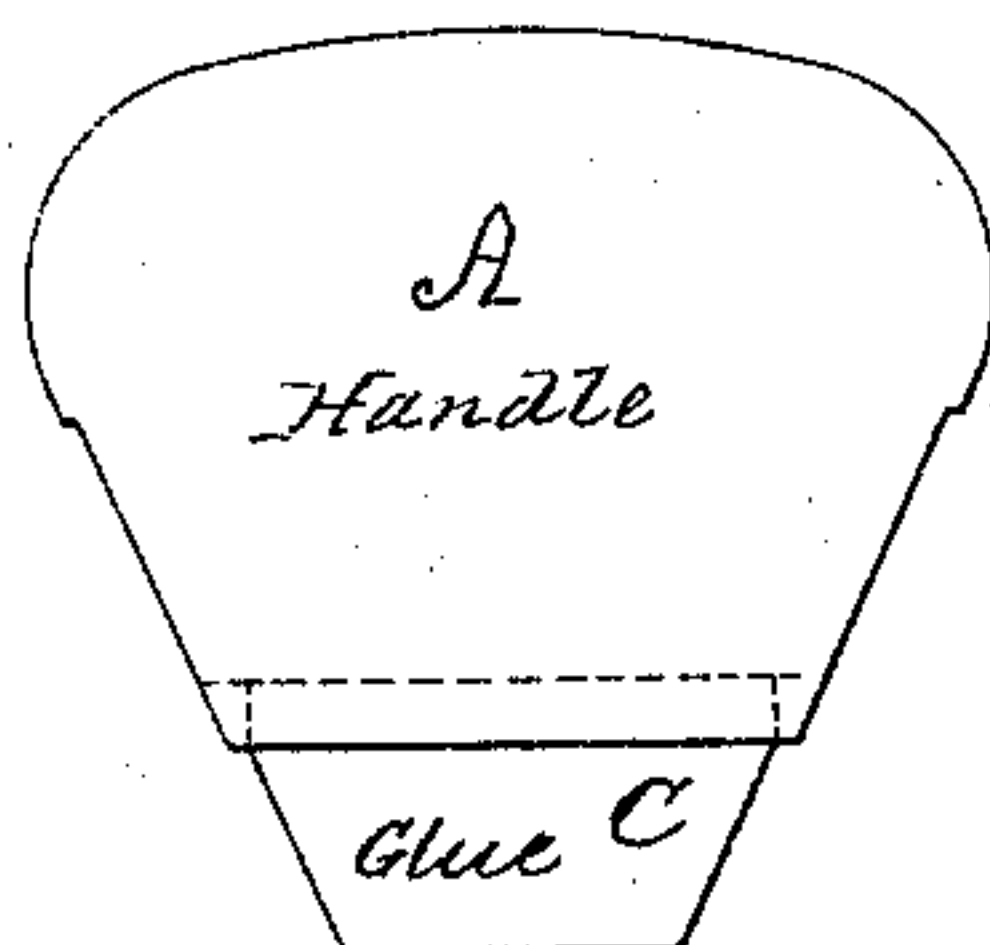

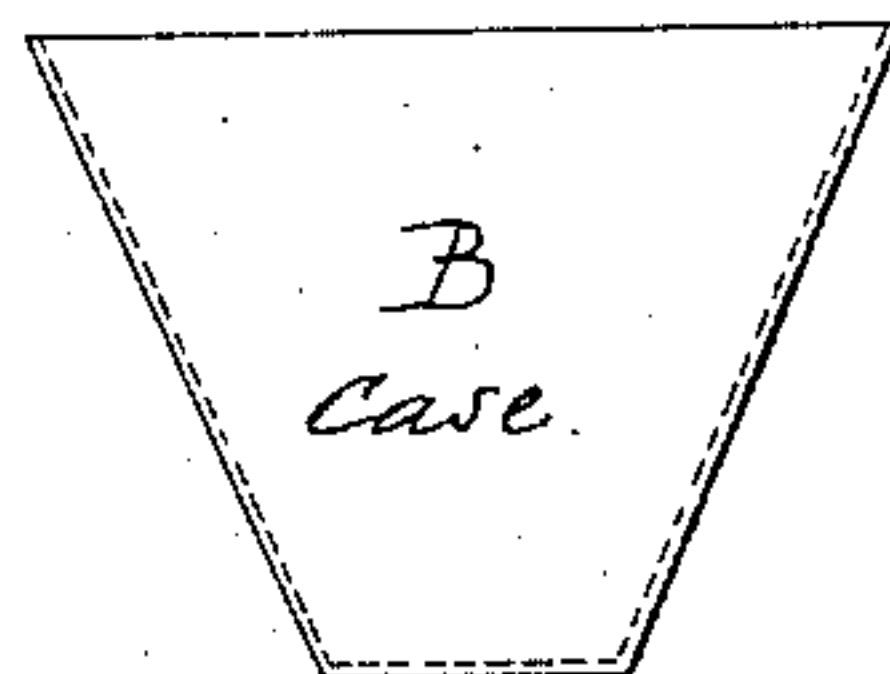

## IMPROVEMENT IN MUCILAGE-HOLDERS.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

I, CHARLES CROZAT CONVERSE, of 37 Portland Avenue, Brooklyn, Kings county, and State of New York, have invented certain Improvements in Glue-Packages, of which the following is a specification.

My invention relates to the providing of pieces of glue, which have been prepared for use in the gluing or gumming of papers, &c, with a handle of wood or other suitable material, and a sheath of tin or other suitable material, the handle being for the convenience of the user, and the sheath rendering the glue portable, the entire article being designed for the convenience of travelers and others who do not desire to use a liquid glue, and who have found the use of solid glue, not provided with a handle to protect the fingers from being soiled thereby, objectionable.

### *Description of the Accompanying Drawing.*

Figure 1 is a view of my glue-package when closed.

Figure 2 is a section thereof, on line *xx* of fig. 1.

Figure 3 represents the glue and handle detached from the sheath.

Figure 4 is the sheath detached.

A is the handle.

*a* is the slot or mortise in the handle for receiving and holding the glue.

B is the sheath, and

C is the glue.

I claim—

As a new article of manufacture, a sealing device of lip glue, combined with the handle A and provided with the sheath B, as herein set forth, for convenient use.
