IMPROVEMENT IN MEDICAL COMPOUNDS FOR FOWLS.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JACOB H. KIPP, of Millers-town, in the county of Perry and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and valuable Improvement in Medical Compounds for Fowls; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same.

My invention relates to medical compounds, and consists in combining and compounding a mixture of a novel character, for the cure of cholera in chickens. It is also useful for the complaint usually known as "gapes" in such fowls.

My medical compound is prepared as follows, namely:

I take one-fourth pound of gentian, one-fourth pound of ginger, one-fourth pound of sulphur, one-fourth pound of charcoal, one-fourth ounce of capsicum, and two ounces of iron-rust.

These ingredients I pulverize and mix thoroughly

together, in a mortar or otherwise, when the preparation is ready for use.

One table-spoonful of this compound is a proper dose for six chickens; if the chickens be very small, a less quantity will suffice.

I advise that the mixture be given in scalded meal, and that a piece of oxidized iron be kept in the vicinity of the diseased fowls.

I claim as my invention—

The combination of the ingredients herein mentioned as a remedy for diseased fowls, substantially as described.
