

IMPROVEMENT IN SEATS FOR STORES.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 116,023, dated June 20, 1871; antedated June 17, 1871.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Daniel Christian, of Chagrin Falls, in the county of Cuyahoga and State of Ohio, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Seats for Stores; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawing forming part of this specification.

My invention relates to seats for stores; and consists in an improved combination of parts for that purpose, as hereinafter described and claimed.

Figure 1 is a perspective, and Figs. 2, 3, and 4 detail views, respectively, of the bottom socket-plate, the bottom of seat, and the bracket.

A is the bracket, having upper arm C, with a hook on the end to fit into socket-piece e; a lower arm, a, with a turned-off and shouldered end; and the side arm D, which has a socket,

f. B is the lower socket, which has a rim, b, with aperture g thereon, and a hole, h, to receive the end of branch a. E is a seat, having a pin, l, in the middle thereof to fit into the socket f. G is the counter, to whose under side the socket-plates are firmly fastened.

The parts being placed together, it will be perceived that the bracket and seat may either be swung under the counter when not in use, or detached entirely.

Having thus described all that is necessary to a full understanding of my invention, what I esteem as new, and desire to protect by Letters Patent, is—

The detachable bracket A and detachable seat E, combined, as described, with the socket-plates and counter, for the purpose specified.
