JULIE DESMARQUES YOUNG, OF SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA.

IMPROVEMENT IN TOILET PASTES.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 116,786, dated July 4, 1871.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JULIE DESMARQUES YOUNG, of the city and county of San Francisco, State of California, have invented a certain compound, called "Elixir de Beaumondaire," to be used on the face and hands for the purpose of healing, rejuvenating, and beautifying the skin, and obliterating all wrinkles.

The nature of the invention consists in the discovery of the peculiar action of the outward application of cod-liver oil (combined with the following-named ingredients) to the human skin as conducive to the above-named effects:

In manufacturing this compound I use one ounce of cod-liver oil, more or less; one-quarter ounce of olive-oil, more or less; thirty drops of alcohol, more or less; five drops of aqua ammo-

nia, more or less; fifteen drops of oil of lemon, more or less; ten drops of bergamot, more or less; tempered to a thick paste with one ounce, more or less, of mutton-fat or white wax.

To prepare it take the mutton-fat or white wax, olive-oil, alcohol, and ammonia; heat them to boiling point in an earthenware vessel; when nearly cold add the cod-liver oil and scents.

I claim as my invention—

The manufacture or preparation of a compound, which is denominated "Elixir de Beaumondaire," of the ingredients, in the proportions, and for the purposes set forth.
