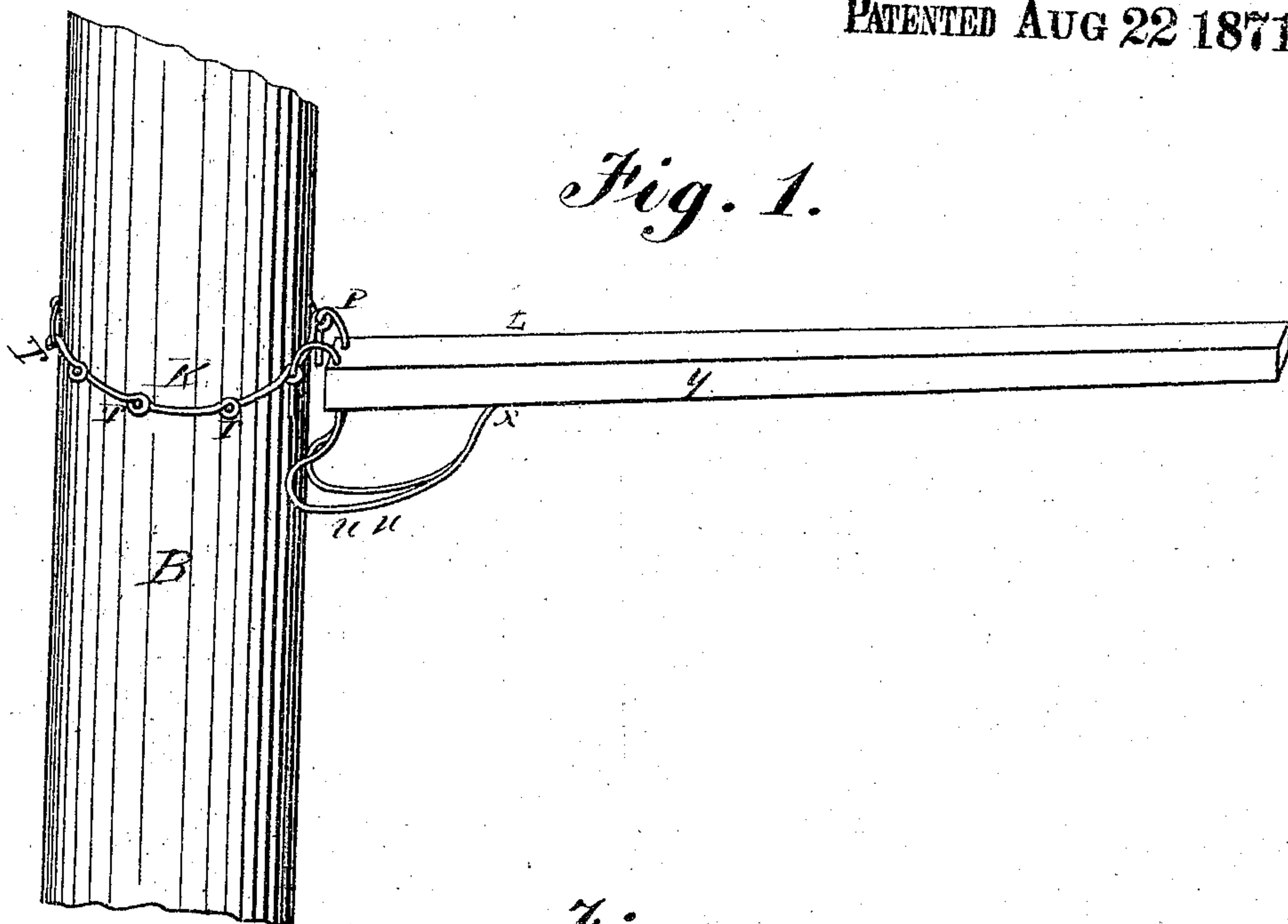

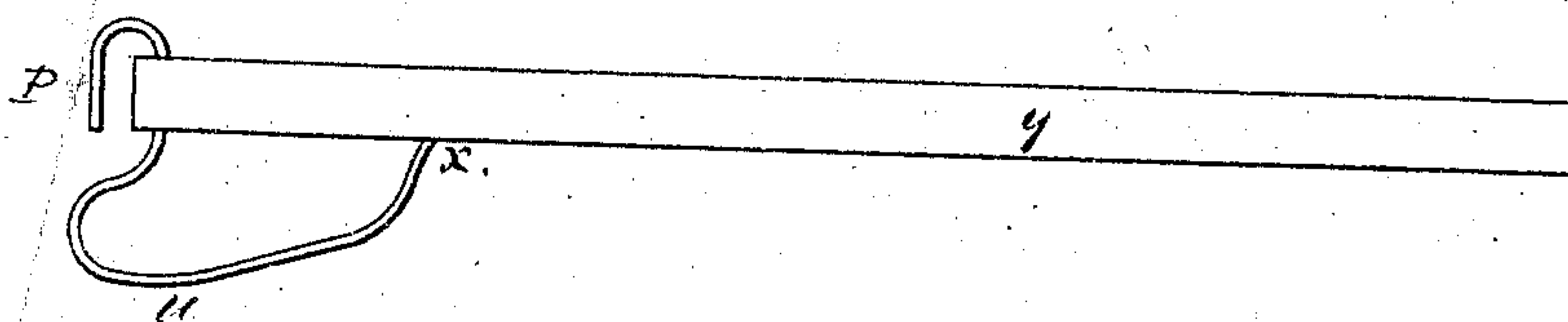
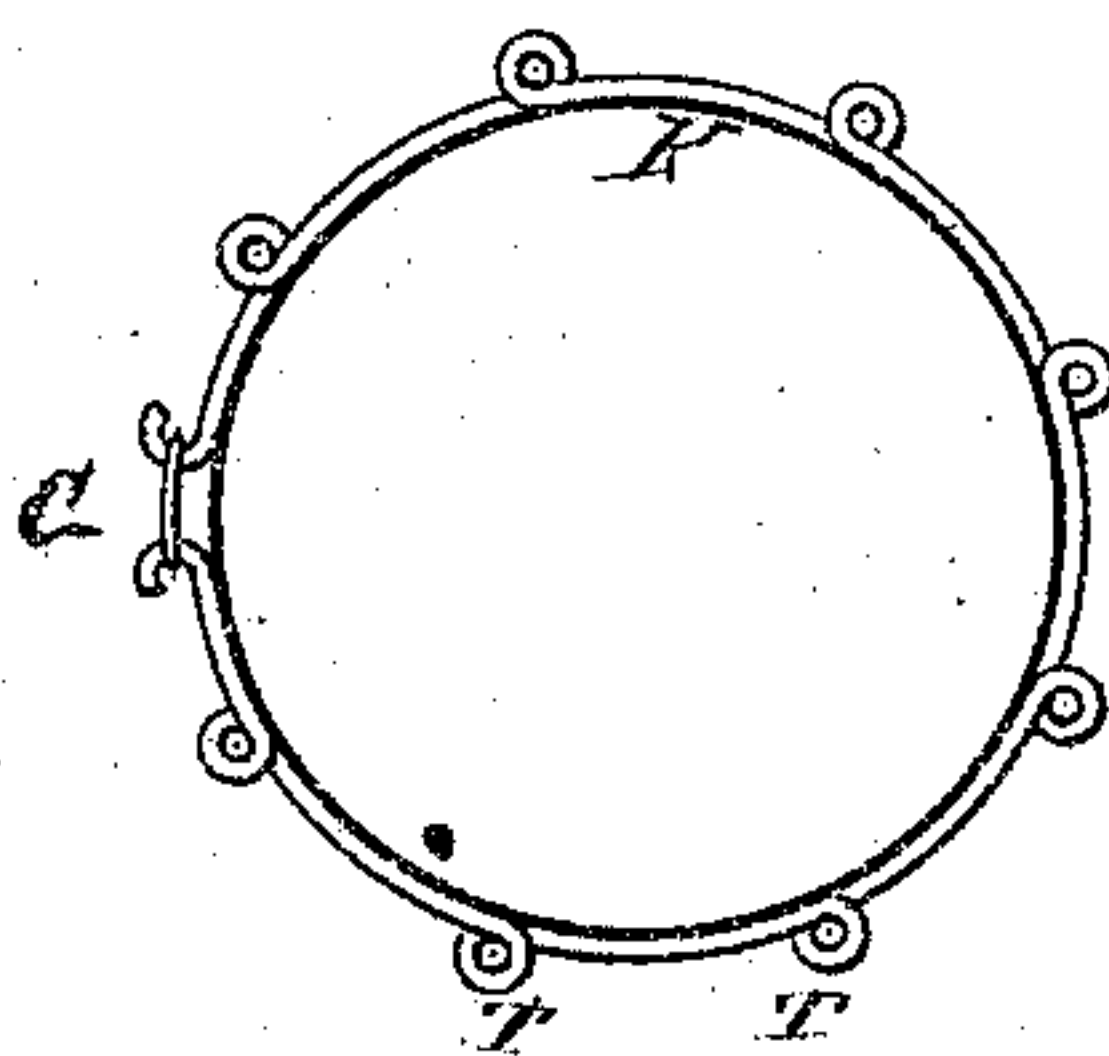

CASSIUS M. HERREMAN, OF MANKATO, MINNESOTA.

IMPROVEMENT IN STOVE-PIPE CLOTHES-DRIERS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 118,241, dated August 22, 1871.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CASSIUS M. HERREMAN, of Mankato, in the county of Blue Earth and State of Minnesota, have invented certain Improvements in Clothes-Drier, of which the following is a specification:

The object of my invention is: First, to dry, air, or warm clothes or cloths. Second, to dry quick, the heat arising from stove coming in direct contact. Third, economy of room.

Figure 1 is a view of my invention as adjusted to pipe for use. Fig. 2 is a side view of the bar or arm. Fig. 3 is a wire band with eyes, (made of one and the same piece of wire,) which encircles the pipe, as in Fig. 1.

The drier is adjusted to stove-pipe B by encircling-band K, (at sufficient height as to be out of way,) fastened by means of a small wire at

G, as a gripe. The bar Y is adjusted by hooking the hooks P P into the eyes T T of band K in a manner that the braces U U may rest against the pipe B as a support, and can be removed at pleasure. The braces U U and hooks P P are of one and the same piece of wire, fastened to bar Y at H with screw or nail, the ends of which pass through the bar Y at L to form hooks.

What I claim as my invention and improvement in clothes-driers is—

The band K, to encircle the pipe, with eyes T T, in combination with bar Y, hooks P P, and braces U U, as shown and described.
