## IMPROVEMENT IN MEDICAL COMPOUNDS OR LINIMENTS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 118,706, dated September 5, 1871.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Gershom H. Fairchild, of the city and county of St. Louis and State of Missouri, have invented a certain new and useful Liniment, of which the following is a specification:

My liniment consists of the following ingredients and well-known compounds in about the proportions named: Opodeldoc, eight ounces; British oil, four ounces; hartshorn, four ounces; alcohol, four ounces; laudanum, two ounces; oil of camphor, one ounce; oil of pepper, one ounce. Total, twenty-four ounces.

The above are mixed together and the liniment is ready for immediate use. It is applied externally and with friction; and is for the relief and cure of rheumatic affections.

I claim as my invention—

The composition above described to form a liniment.
