IMPROVEMENT IN BITTERS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 120,042, dated October 17, 1871.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDOUARD EDMOND CRADY, of Sioux City, in the county of Woodbury and State of Iowa, have invented a new and valuable Improvement in Compounds; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same.

My invention relates to a new and useful compound or mixture; and it consists in combining and compounding a mixture or tonic of the following ingredients, which is designed to purify the blood and act as an invigorating medicine upon the general system.

I take twelve and one-half ounces of orangepeel; five ounces of gentian; two ounces and two scruples of cinnamon-bark; two ounces and

two scruples of star anise-seed; five drachms of cloves; five ounces of lemon-peel; five pints of simple sirup; twelve and one-half pints of spirits of wine; and twenty pints of distilled water.

These ingredients are mixed together and allowed to stand for two weeks, and then I percolate the extract off, when it is ready for use.

I claim as my invention—

The herein-described compound, composed of the ingredients named, substantially as and for the purpose set forth.
