


IMPROVEMENT IN DESK OR TABLE ATTACHMENTS FOR CHAIRS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 120,234, dated October 24, 1871.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, SAMUEL L. BLIGH, of Pit Hole City, in the county of Venango and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and valuable Improvement in Desk or Table Attachment for Chairs; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the construction and operation of the same, reference being had to the annexed drawing making a part of this specification, and to the letters and figures of reference marked thereon.

Figure 1 of the drawing is a perspective view of my invention. Fig. 2 is a rear view of the same.

This invention consists in the construction and arrangement of a novel adjustable desk or table attachment for chairs, which may be applied to any ordinary chair, and used for the purposes of writing, reading, &c.

Referring to the accompanying drawing illustrating this invention, A represents a chair; B B, a pair of legs, pivoted at their upper ends to a pair of arms, *b*, which are pivoted or attached to a transverse bar, *c*. C represents a desk or table-

leaf, placed across the arms *b* in front of the chair. It is pivoted to one of said arms, so that it may be turned around, as desired. D D are intended to represent adjustable clasps for securing the bar *c* to the back of the chair, as shown in the drawing.

The joints of the described attachment are pivoted so that the height and incline of the desk-leaf may be varied to suit the occupant of the chair; also, to allow the apparatus to be folded up behind the chair.

I claim as my invention.

The improved adjustable desk or table attachment for chairs, having the legs B, pivoted arms *b*, pivoted leaf *c*, and adjustable clasps or fastenings D, as described.
