

## IMPROVEMENT IN KITCHEN-TABLES.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 122,225, dated December 26, 1871.

Specification of certain Improvements in Extension Tables, invented by Henry Closterman, Jr., of Cincinnati, in the county of Hamilton and State of Ohio.

My invention relates to that class of tables which may be made to occupy less space when not in use than when fully extended; and consists in a double top to the table, hinged at one end in such a manner that when a table-surface of greater dimensions is required the upper section of the top may be turned over until it rests upon legs and side rails which have been drawn out from within the sides of the table for the purpose of supporting the extended top.

Figure 1 is a perspective view of a table embodying my invention, the dotted lines showing the extended condition of the supporting-frame. Fig. 2 is a partial horizontal section of the same extended.

My table is constructed with an oblong top, B, to one end of which is hinged a second similar

top, B', so that it may fold over and rest upon it, as shown in Fig. 1. The top B is attached to side rails or supports C and legs A A in customary manner. D are extension side rails or supports sliding within the rails C, and supported at the outer or free end on legs E.

In ordinary domestic use the table is of small dimensions, as shown. When to be used as an ironing-table the folding top B' is turned over onto the extension D E, which is slidden out from its position inside the rails C and beneath the table-top B.

I claim as my invention—

The folding and extensible top B' and supports D E, in conbination with the table A C, when constructed and arranged in the manner herein shown, and for the purpose specified.
