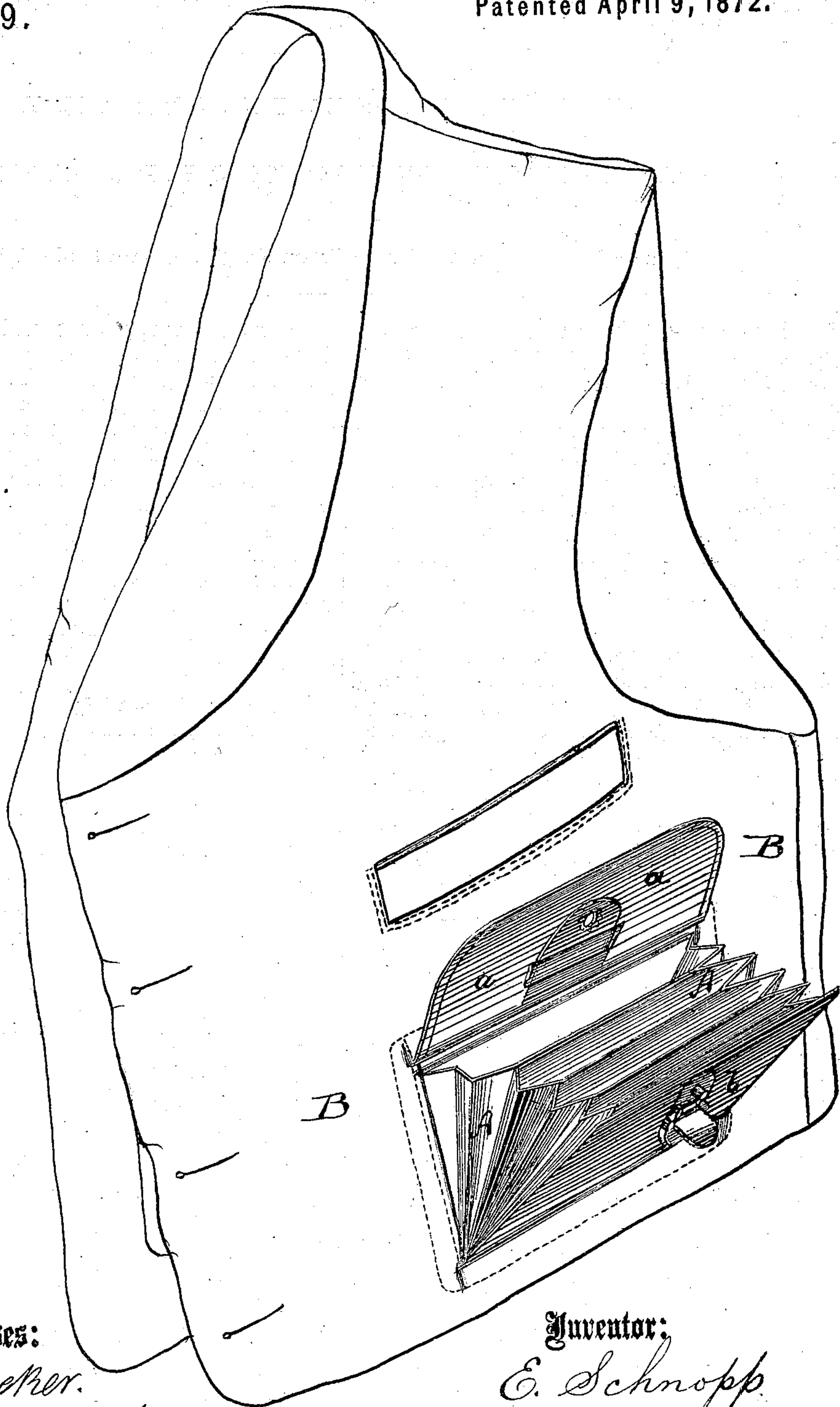

IMPROVEMENT IN MONEY-POCKETS FOR GARMENTS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 125,489, dated April 9, 1872.

Specification describing a new and Improved Money-Pocket, invented by ERNEST SCHNOPP, of East New York, in the county of Kings and State of New York.

The drawing represents a perspective view of my improved money-pocket.

This invention relates to a new combination of pocket-books with articles of wearing apparel, consisting in the direct application of such books to the garments as pockets, thereby providing the necessary divisions, &c., without requiring the carrying of a separate receptacle.

A in the drawing represents a pocket-book applied as pocket to an article, B, of wearing apparel for ladies or gentlemen, it being applied under the outer fabric of the garment

like any ordinary pocket, and closed by a flap, *a*, which is also covered with the fabric constituting the garment B. The interior of the pocket-book is of suitable construction, also the snap or lock *b*, whereby the same is closed.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The combination of garment B, and pocket-book A having its several interior pockets, lapel, and clasp, as and for the purpose set forth.
