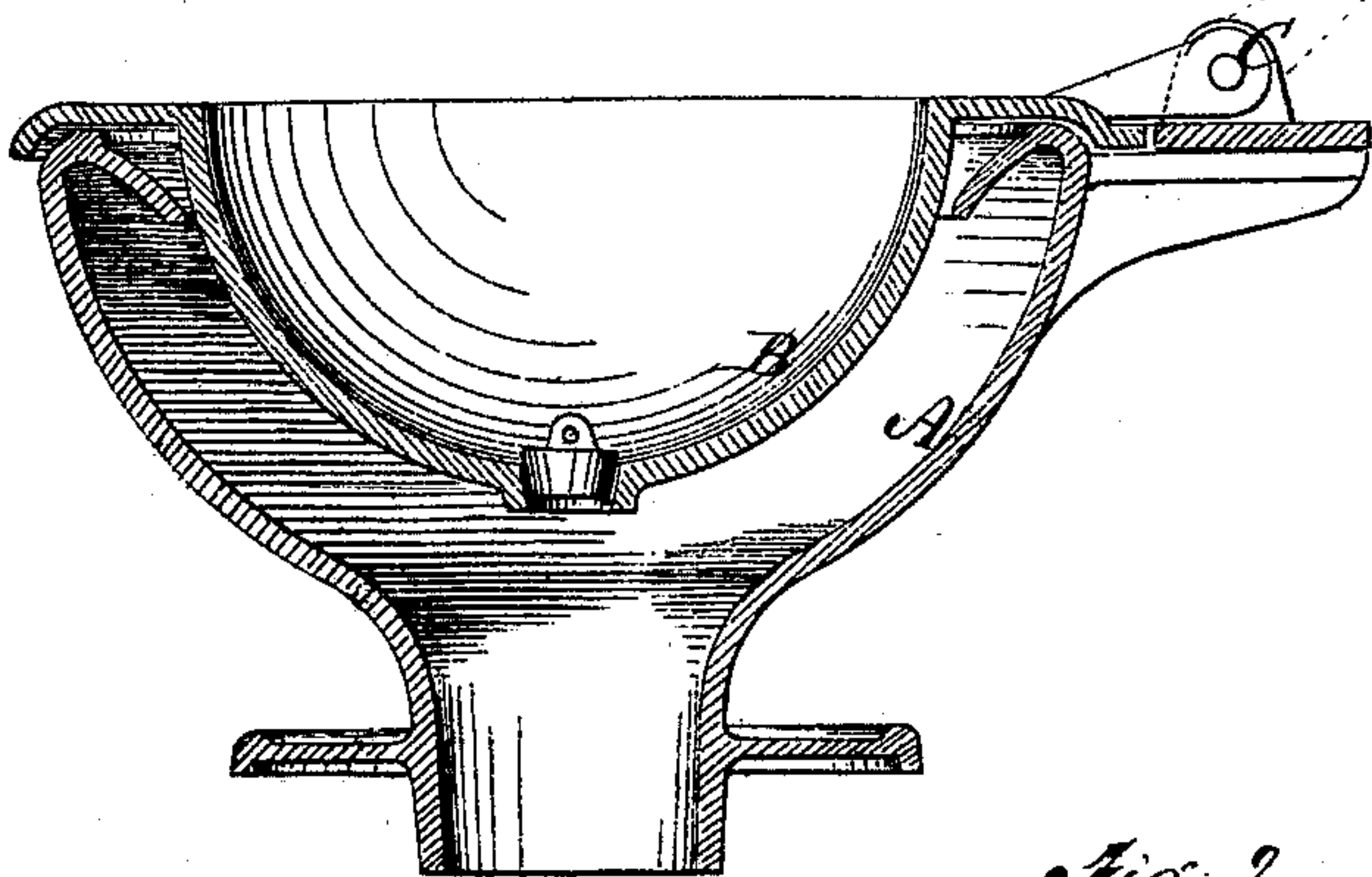
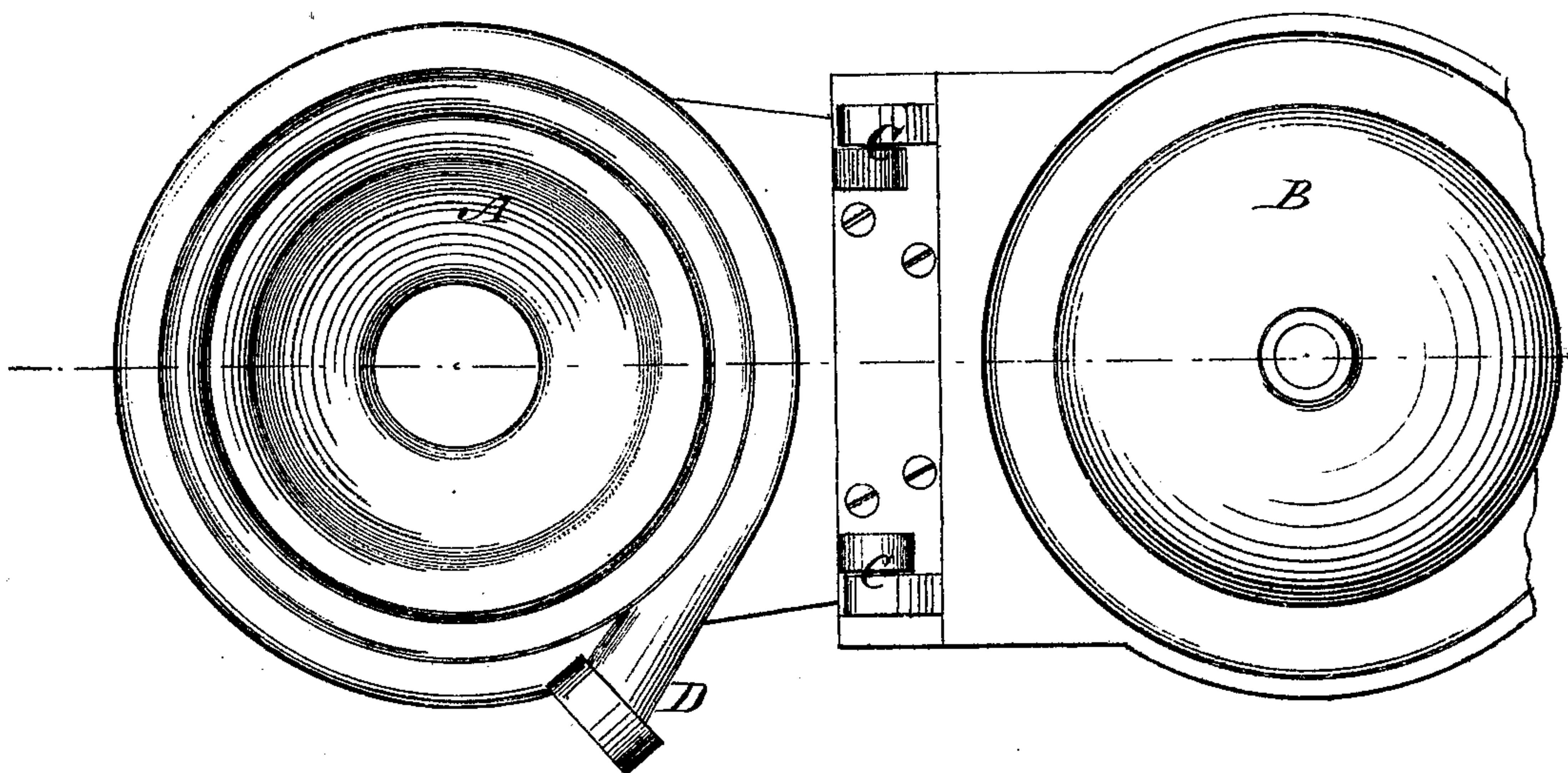

## IMPROVEMENT IN WASH-BASINS WITH URINAL ATTACHMENTS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 126,478, dated May 7, 1872.

Specification describing a new and Improved Combined Water-Closet and Wash-Basin, invented by JORDAN L. MOTT, of Mott Haven, in the county of Westchester and State of New York.

My invention consists of a water-closet and wash-basin combined in one apparatus for prisons.

Figure 1 is a sectional elevation of the apparatus, and Fig. 2 is a plan view, the wash-basin being raised off from the water-closet basin.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

A is the water-closet basin, and B the wash-basin. They are hinged together at C so that the wash-basin C rests on the top of the water-closet basin and forms the cover thereof when in the position for washing; but when the water-closet basin is to be used the said wash-basin swings up and backward, as indicated by the lines in Fig. 1. D is the water-pipe for

washing out the closet. The pipe for filling the wash-basin may be connected with this or the pipe connecting to it, and may either be in the form of a faucet, so arranged as to turn away from over basin C to allow it to swing up, or it may be a flexible pipe.

This plan is calculated to economize considerably in the cost of plumbing, and simplifies the apparatus considerably, which is desirable for prisons and the like.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

A water-closet and wash-basin combined in such manner that the wash-basin constitutes the cover of the water-closet, substantially as specified.
