


IMPROVEMENT IN PRINTERS' CASE-STANDS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 129,281, dated July 16, 1872.

Specification describing a new and Improved Printers' Case-Stand, invented by Peter S. Hoe, of the city, county, and State of New York.

Nature and Objects of the Invention.

My said invention relates to type-stands used by printers. The invention consists in a printer's case-stand, made of pipe and couplings, so that it can be readily taken apart for transportation and removal, while it is very strong, light, neat, and ornamental in appearance; and has for its object to make a better case-stand than has heretofore been made.

The drawing, Figures 1, 2, and 3, shows a perspective view and parts in detail of a case-stand constructed in accordance with my invention.

General Description.

I take, of any desired size, iron pipe, say half-inch or three-quarters, the desired lengths, and, with proper couplings, screw the whole together, as shown in the drawing. The couplings

are cast with the projecting screw-ends of the desired number in the desired place upon them, as shown. The rods cc have a set-off formed by a coupling or equivalent for the edge of the back tray of the case-stand, while the front tray will rest against the edge of the couplings at aa. To the upright rods A A are attached, in any proper manner, by screws, rivets, or clamps, angle-pieces B B, in which the trays rest. It will be understood that the lengths of pipe that make up the case are right and left screw-threaded. The case thus made is light, and can readily be made portable by unscrewing the parts.

I claim, as a new article of manufacture— A printer's case-stand, constructed of pipe, substantially in the manner described and specified.
