

IMPROVEMENT IN BOTTLES.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 132,020, dated October 8, 1872.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Benjamin C. Odell, of Kingston, in the county of Ulster and State of New York, have invented a new and Improved Bottle, of which the following is a specification:

Figure 1 represents a vertical longitudinal section of my improved bottle. Fig. 2 is a vertical transverse section of the same.

Similar letters of reference indicate corre-

sponding parts.

This invention relates to a new style of bottle for use in the dispensing of medicaments and other articles; and has for its object to separate within the same bottle two or more kinds of matter which can be separately removed to be mixed or not, as may be found most agreeable or proper. The invention consists in arranging one or more partitions within the bottle, thus dividing it into two or more separate vessels or receptacles, each of which has its own discharge neck or spout. This enables the putting up of several ingredients

whose mixture in the same bottle may not be required, but which, nevertheless, it is desirable to have at hand together.

A, in the drawing, represents my improved bottle. It is provided with a partition, a, which divides it into two compartments, b and c, of suitable proportionate size. Each of these compartments has its own neck and mouth d e, and can be closed by a suitable stopple.

In place of one there may be more partitions. The bottle can be used for liquid, powdered, or other substances.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The bottle having one or more partitions and two or more necks, substantially as described.
