IMPROVEMENT IN MEDICAL COMPOUNDS FOR CURE OF FEVER AND AGUE.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 134,639, dated January 7, 1873.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WALTER CAMPBELL, of Camden, in the county of Camden and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and valuable Medical Compound, a remedy for fever and ague; and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same.

The ingredients which make up my improved compound, which I call the "Fever and Ague Conqueror," are as follows, and in the proportions named: One dram quinine, thirty drops spirits niter, forty drops turpentine, thirty drops vitriol, four drams red pepper, four drams sulphur, one quart rye whisky, and four drams oil of stone.

This compound is a reliable cure for the fever and ague, and may be used with benefit in the treatment of other complaints.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The compound composed substantially of the ingredients herein named, for the purpose set forth.
