


IMPROVEMENT IN CLASPS FOR SUSPENDERS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 141,087, dated July 22, 1873; application filed January 15, 1873.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Joseph William Smith, of Boston, in the State of Massachusetts, have invented certain Improvements in Suspenders, of which the following is a specification:

My invention relates to so combining one strap with another, or with others, that each shall remain adjustable relatively to the other; and consists in the use of the device shown in Fig. 2 of the drawings in the manner shown in Figure 1. This device is a slide and buckle combined. The strap A is inserted in the slide portion of this device, and the strap C in the buckle portion, and it is clear that the strap

A can be adjusted relatively to the strap C by slipping it through the slide-portion of the device; and, when adjusted, be properly held in place. It is also clear that the strap C can be adjusted relatively to the strap A by slipping it through the buckle portion of the device, and that this strap C, also, when adjusted, will be properly held in place.

I claim as my invention—
