

IMPROVEMENT IN CAN-COVERS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 150,602, dated May 5, 1874; application filed August 6, 1873.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM L. PALMER, of Leonardsville, in the county of Madison and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Covers or Tops for Cans, &c.; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, which form a part of this specification.

My invention relates to that class of covers for cans which have a hoop to fit inside of the mouth or neck of the can; and it consists in the means employed for contracting and ex-

panding the cover-hoop.

In order to enable others skilled in the art to which my invention appertains to make and use the same, I will now proceed to describe its construction and operation, referring to the annexed drawing, in which the two figures represent vertical sections of a can mouth or neck with my improved cover placed thereon.

A represents the mouth or neck of a can; and B is the cover thereto, provided with a hoop, C, to fit into the mouth A. This hoop is left loose at the joint a, and on the inner side of the hoop, on each side of the joint, is

an eye or loop, b, through which two loops pass the inclined sides of a wedge-shaped frame, D. The upper larger end of this frame is provided with a shank, f, which passes up through an aperture in the cover B, and is provided with a knob, G.

It will readily be seen that by pulling up the frame D the hoop C is contracted, while by pushing it down the hoop is expanded; and hence the cover can be made as tight as desired after being placed in the can, and still it may be removed with perfect case.

Having thus fully described my invention what I claim as new, and desire to secure by

Letters Patent, is-

The combination of the cover-hoop C, made loose at the joint, and provided with eyes or loops b, and the wedge-shaped frame D, with shank f and knob G, substantially as and for the purposes herein set forth.
