IMPROVEMENT IN MEDICAL COMPOUNDS OR LINIMENTS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 152,874, dated July 7, 1874; application filed April 25, 1874.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, HIRAM F. SLONE and LAUNCELOT GILROY, of Kingston, Fresno county, State of California, have invented a Medical Compound; and we do hereby declare the following description is sufficient to enable any person skilled in the art or science to which it most nearly appertains to make and use our said invention without further invention or experiment.

Our invention relates to a new and useful compound or liniment for curing nervous affections, bowel diseases, hurts, sores, colds, and other complaints for which a liniment or pain-killer has heretofore been used.

To make our liniment we first dissolve one-fourth $\binom{1}{4}$ of a pound of camphor in one gallon of alcohol, and to this solution we add the following ingredients, in the proportions named: Aqua ammonia, four (4) ounces; origanum, four (4) ounces; laudanum, four (4)

ounces; chloroform, four (4) ounces; spirits of turpentine, one (1) pint; oil sassafras, one (1) ounce.

The mixture is then ready to be used. This liniment can be taken internally in small doses or applied externally.

Having thus described our invention, what we claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A medical compound consisting of laudanum, in combination with camphor, aqua ammonia, origanum, chloroform, spirits of turpentine, and oil of sassafras, substantially in the proportions set forth.
