

IMPROVEMENT IN COMBINED KNIVES AND TAPE-LINES.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 166,099, dated July 27, 1875; application filed June 8, 1875.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GLOVER S. HASTINGS, of Unionville, Hartford county, Connecticut, have invented a Combined Pocket-Knife and Tape - Measure, of which the following is a specification:

The object of my invention is to so construct the handle of a pocket-knife that it may be made available as a casing for containing a tape-measure without interfering with its duties as a knife-handle, and this object I attain in the manner which I will now proceed to describe, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective view of a pocketknife with my improvement, and Fig. 2 a side

view, partly in section.

A circular chamber is formed at the rear end of the handle, partly by a ring, a, and partly by continuations b of the cheek-pieces B of the said handle, the ring being confined

between and secured to these continuations. Round a pulley, E, contained in this chamber, is wound the usual tape-measure, the pulley being provided with the ordinary coiled spring, which tends to maintain the graduated tape within the chamber in a manner too well known to need description.

I claim as my invention—

The combination described, of a chamber for containing a tape-measure, with the handle of a pocket-knife, the said chamber being bounded partly by the ring a, and partly by continuations b of the said cheek-pieces of the handle, all substantially as set forth.
