

IMPROVEMENT IN WASHER-CUTTERS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 168,607, dated October 11, 1875; application filed August 14, 1875.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EMERY BRULÉ, of Neillsville, in the county of Clark and State of Wisconsin, have invented a new and useful Improvement in an Apparatus for Cutting Leather Washers, which improvement is set forth in the following specification:

The invention consists in clamping the cutters A A in the slot of the holder by means of a screw cut upon the upper section of the holder, which enters the upper end of the lower section, passing into a slot or seat cut in that section in which the cutter-tangs are held. The holder is constructed of two parts, which

are provided with a screw-connection, as is shown in the drawings.

I claim as my invention—

An apparatus for cutting leather washers, the cutter-holder constructed of two sections, C D, in combination with the cutters A A, adjustably held in a slot of section D by means of a screw-connection, substantially as shown and described.
