




IMPROVEMENT IN PLUMBERS' GRAPPLES.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 179,533, dated July 4, 1876; application filed June 6, 1876.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM H. DEWAR, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and Improved Plumber's Grapple, of which the following is a specification:

Figure 1 is a side elevation. Figs. 2, 3, and

4 are detail views.

Similar letters of reference indicate corre-

sponding parts.

My invention consists in the combination of suitable jaws with rods or tubes in such a way that the jaws may be operated in pipes or other narrow places for removing obstructions, and for other purposes.

A is the fixed part of the jaw, which is attached to a pipe or rod, B. It is offset at C, and made double to receive a movable jaw, D, which is pivoted or jointed to the fixed part at a. The jaw is curved in the direction of its length; the outer end is also curved transversely, with the convex side outward. A

Short arm, E, is attached to the movable jaw D, to which a rod, b, is pivoted. The rod b and pipe B are held together at intervals by rings C, which admit of moving the rods in the direction of their length, but prevent their springing apart. The jaw D is provided with teeth d, and the jaw A is provided with a single spur, e.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters

Patent-

The combination of jaw A, attached to rod B, having offset at C, and provided with spur c, movable jaw D, having teeth d, pivoted at a, and having a short arm, E, and the pivoted rod b, the rod and pipe being held by rings e, all as shown and described.
