


IMPROVEMENT IN TEMPORARY BINDERS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 180,871, dated August 8, 1876; application filed June 26, 1876.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FERDINAND GUICHE-State of New York, have invented a new and Improved Temporary Binder, of which the following is a specification:

Figure 1 is a perspective view. Fig. 2 is a transverse section.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

My invention consists in the combination of a spring-clip of novel construction with the back of a book-shaped box or receptacle, in such a way that letters, invoices, and other similar papers may be placed on a pair of needles fixed to the said back and retained by a spring, which is slotted, and so placed as to be capable of following the papers down on the needles.

A is a book-shaped box or receptacle, having the back B hinged to the bottom C at a. The back is arc-shaped on the outside, but is filled in with a block, b, on the inside, making a level surface. The cover D is attached to the back, and divided into the parts c and d,

which are hinged together at e. Two needles, ff', are rigidly attached to the part c, and pro-TEAU, of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and | ject at right angles from it a small distance from and parallel to the block b. E is an angle-plate or bracket, which is attached to the block b, and supports a spring, g. This spring is slotted at h h to receive the needles ff'. The ends i i' of the end pieces j j' are arcshaped, and fit the inside of the back B, projecting beyond the bottom C, and when the receptacle is closed they shut by the block b, making a dust-proof joint.

Papers to be filed are placed on the needles ff' and retained by the spring g.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

A temporary binder, having the back B, block b, and elongated end pieces i i', combined and arranged substantially as and for the purpose specified.
