

IMPROVEMENT IN WRENCHES.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 181,699, dated August 29, 1876; application filed February 26, 1876.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Thomas McDonough, of Mont Clair, Essex county, New Jersey, have invented Improvements in Wrenches, of which the following is a specification:

My invention consists in the construction and arrangement of the several parts composing a wrench, which I will proceed to describe.

In the accompanying drawing, A and B are the two arms, pivoted at C, which form the body of the wrench. These arms are each provided with a jaw at both ends, as shown.

a and b are curved slots cut through the arms, and crossing each other nearly at right angles in all positions of the arms.

D is a clamp-screw, that passes through the

slots a b, and secures the arms at any desired point.

This mode of adjustment forms the subject of a patent for an improvement in calipers and dividers, granted to me February 22, 1876, No. 173,802, and I do not, therefore, claim said mode of adjustment in this application; but

I claim—

A wrench constructed with pivoted arms, provided with jaws at each end, simultaneously adjustable, substantially as described.
