



## IMPROVEMENT IN BLANK-BOOKS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 185,205, dated December 12, 1876; application filed August 28, 1876.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, H. S. ARCHER, of New York city and State, have invented a Blank-Book, of which the following is a specification:

Figure 1 is a view of the blank-book when open, showing a portion of one leaf in position. Fig. 2 is a cross-section of Fig. 1 on line  $x \, x$ . Fig. 3 is a cross-section of the book when closed.

The invention consists in a blank-book having leaves recessed and held by clamp-nut and screw, as hereinafter described.

A represents the cover, having a flexible back, B, stiffening-plates C, screws D, and clamp-nuts E. The leaves or sheets, F, of paper are recessed or open-slotted at a, to bring them readily under the pressure of the clamp-

nuts E, and to allow them to be readily slid out after the nuts are loosened. It thus becomes easy to remove any sheets whose reading-matter has become valueless, or whose memoranda have served the purpose for which they were originally intended.

Having thus described all that is necessary to a full understanding of the invention, what I claim is—

The blank-book A B C, having its leaves open-slotted at a, and held by clamp-nuts working on screws D, as and for the purpose specified.
