


IMPROVEMENT IN ARM-RESTS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 189, 157, dated April 3, 1877; application filed January 19, 1877.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Philo R. Wagor, of Rockport, in the county of Atchison and State of Missouri, have invented a new and Improved Arm-Rest, of which the following is a specification:

Figure 1 is a side elevation of my improved arm-rest. Fig. 2 is a top view of the device

for fastening the rest to a table.

Similar letters of reference indicate corre-

sponding parts.

My invention relates to a novel device to be attached to a desk or table for supporting the arm while writing.

The invention will first be fully described in connection with the drawing, and then

pointed out in the claim.

In the drawing, D is a support for the standard B, which consists of an arm, E, provided with a sleeve, b', for receiving the standard B, and with a set-screw, c', for binding the same, the said arm being jointed to a fixed arm, F,

projecting from a plate, G, which is screwed to the table.

The arm-rest is adjusted to the required height to suit books of different thickness, and in working on large sheets of paper or maps covering the whole desk, it is used to widen the desk, thus making it convenient to write on the extreme lower edge of the sheet.

It also can be used with equal advantage in

any position the writer may assume.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The arm E, having the sleeve b' and screw c', arm F, plate G, standard B, and board C, combined substantially as herein shown and described.
