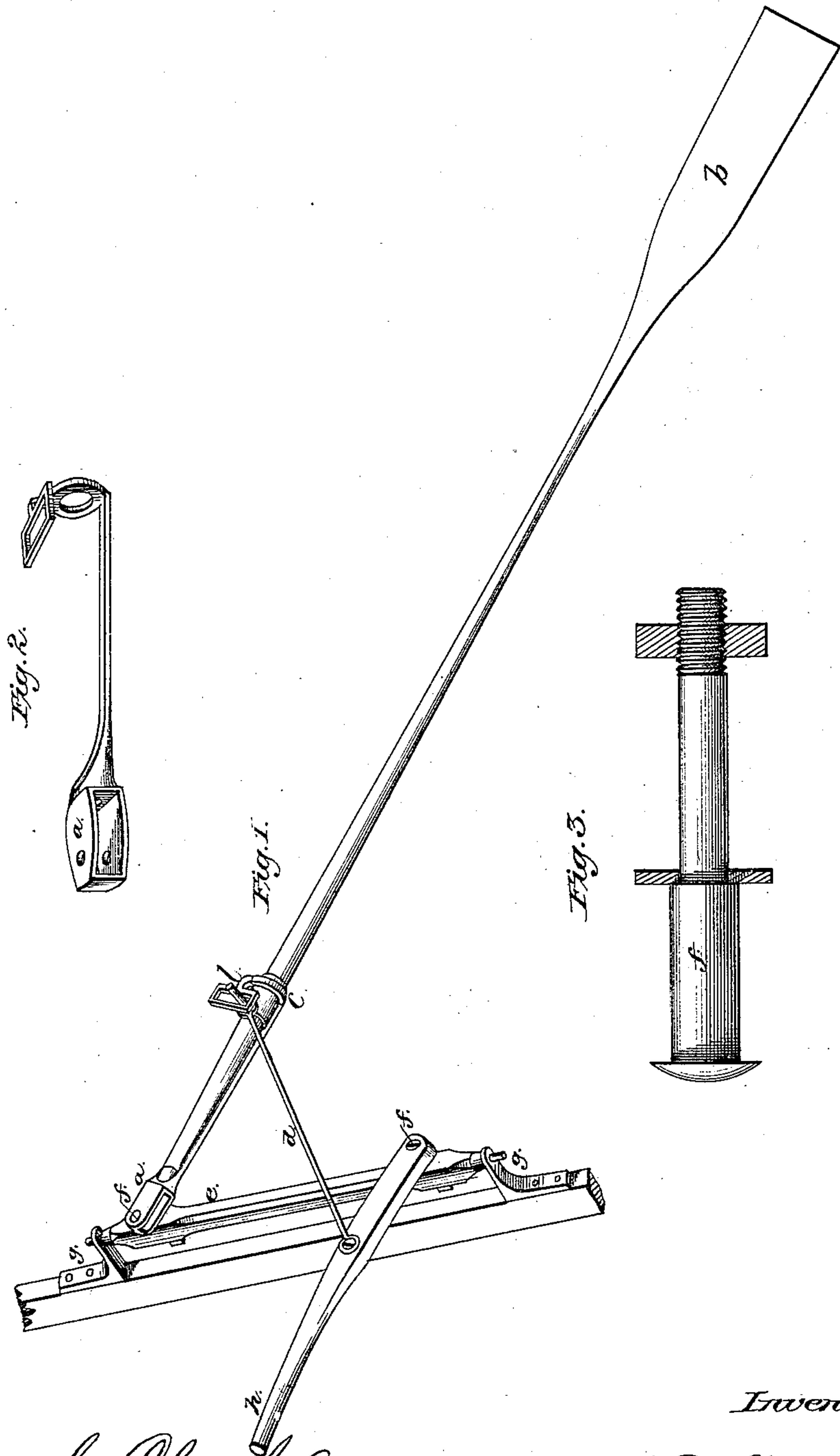

JOHN W. MELCHER, OF OSHKOSH, WISCONSIN.

IMPROVEMENT IN ROWING-GEAR.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **192,382**, dated June 26, 1877; application filed February 28, 1877.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN W. MELCHER, of Oshkosh, in the county of Winnebago, and in the State of Wisconsin, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Rowing-Gear; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, and to the letters of reference marked thereon, making a part of this specification.

The object of my invention is to enable a person, when rowing, to sit facing the bow of boat; and this is done by the combination of rowing-gear, consisting of handle *h* and draw-bar *d*, connected to the oar, with the pin *l* in the slot of the iron *a*, in which the pin *l*, when rowing, works back and forth, and causes the oar to feather with every stroke, and the oar and handle connected to the rolling bar *e* with the bolts *f f*, and the rolling bar hung to the boat, and with the irons *g g*, as shown in the perspective view, Figure 1, of the accompanying drawing.

The rowing-gear is illustrated more in detail in the accompanying figures, of which Fig. 2

is the iron in which oar is hung, and Fig. 3 the bolt *f*.

b is the blade, having band *c*; *d*, the draw-bar; *e*, rolling bar; *f*, the bolt; *g*, the iron which the rolling bar is hung in; *h*, the handle which operates the oar; *l*, the pin that fits in the band *c* and fastens the oar in the band and connects the oar and handle.

It will be evident that the slot in the iron *a* could be made in the iron under the draw-bar around the oar and band *c*, and a head on the pin *l* would answer the same purpose to operate and feather the oar as the slot shown.

I claim as my invention—

The combination, in rowing-gear, substantially as described, of a handle and draw-bar, with slot and pin connected with oar, and rolling bar hung to the rail of boat.
