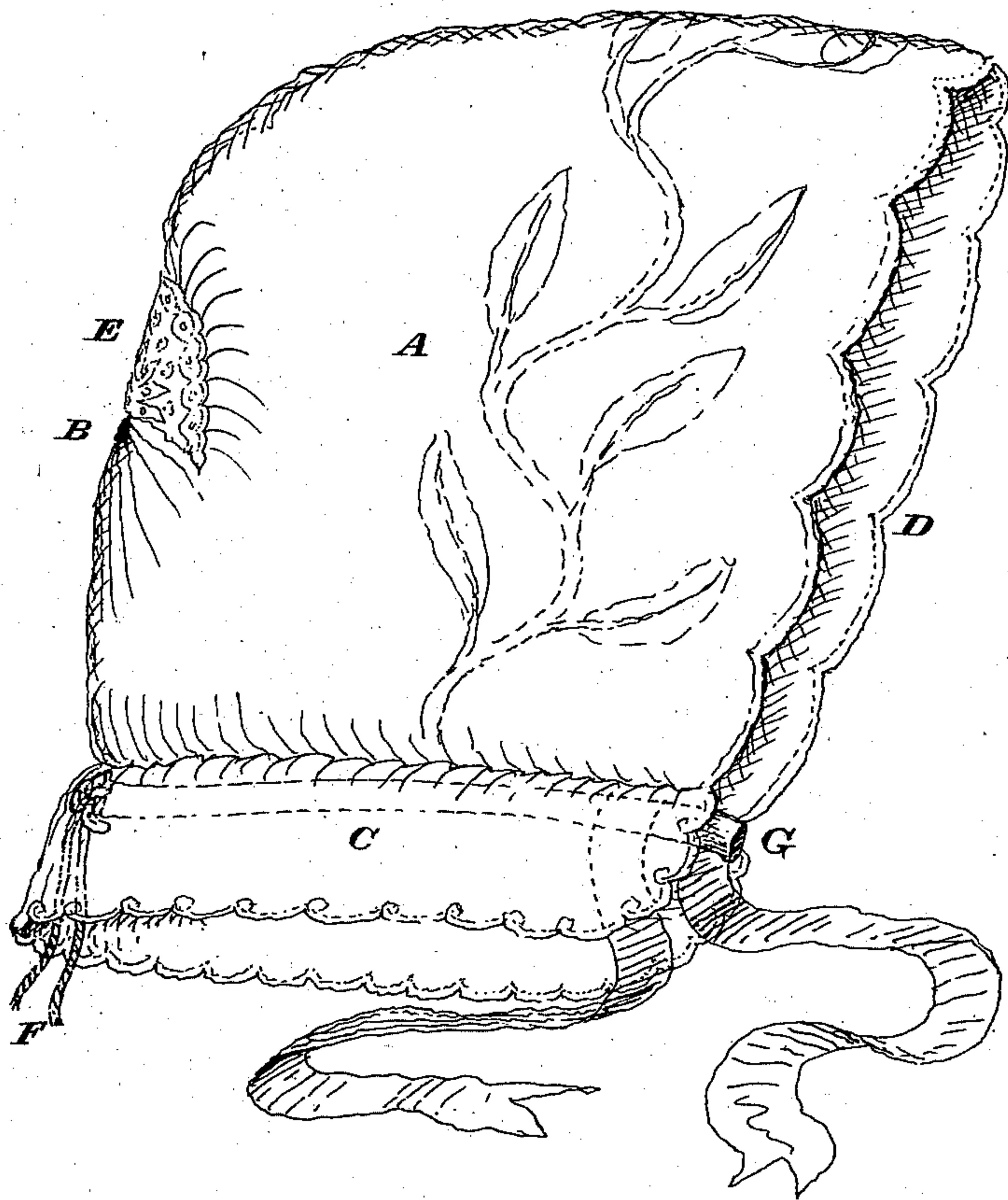

IMPROVEMENT IN CHILD'S EMBROIDERED CAPS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **214,550**, dated April 22, 1879; application filed March 19, 1879.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM G. CALDWELL, of Cincinnati, Hamilton county, Ohio, have invented a new and useful Manufacture of Child's Embroidered Caps, of which the following is a specification.

My invention consists in forming the body or head piece of an embroidered cap for children of a single piece of muslin or gauze fabric, A, drawn in and gathered at or near the crown, as at B, and having its lower edge gathered and stitched to a gathered frill, C. The edges of the head-piece and frill have a scalloped or other embroidered border, D.

An ornamental embroidered crown-piece or rosette, E, may be stitched over and hide the crown-gather.

Drawing-strings F, secured in a hem or sheath, G, may serve to draw in or let out the neck.

A frill may be added to the front margin; also, suitable ties and silk or other lining.

I claim as new and of my invention—

The child's embroidered cap having its head-piece formed of a single piece of embroidered stuff, substantially as set forth.
