


IMPROVEMENT IN BUTTONS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 216,811, dated June 24, 1879; application filed November 4, 1878.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Samuel W. Shorey, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented an Improvement in Buttons, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, which form a part of this specification.

The object of my invention is to provide a button with a metallic fastening that may readily be applied to boots, shoes, and other articles without the use of a machine, and as easily removed without the loss of any part.

My invention consists in attaching to an eye-button a screw-eye provided with a nut of suitable size, to correspond with the goods to which the button is to be attached. I prefer to make the nut with a shank of sufficient length to pass through the fabric.

My invention is more fully set forth in the

accompanying drawings, in which Figure 1 is a sectional view of a piece of fabric with a button attached by my improved method. Fig. 2 shows a button having the screw-eye attached and the nut screwed on.

In the drawings, A represents the fabric; B, a button; C, the button-eye; D, the screw-eye attached to the button-eye; E, the nut screwed on.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

An eye-button provided with a screw-eye or shank and a screw-threaded nut, to adapt it for attachment to boots, shoes, and other articles, substantially in the manner and for the purposes specified.
