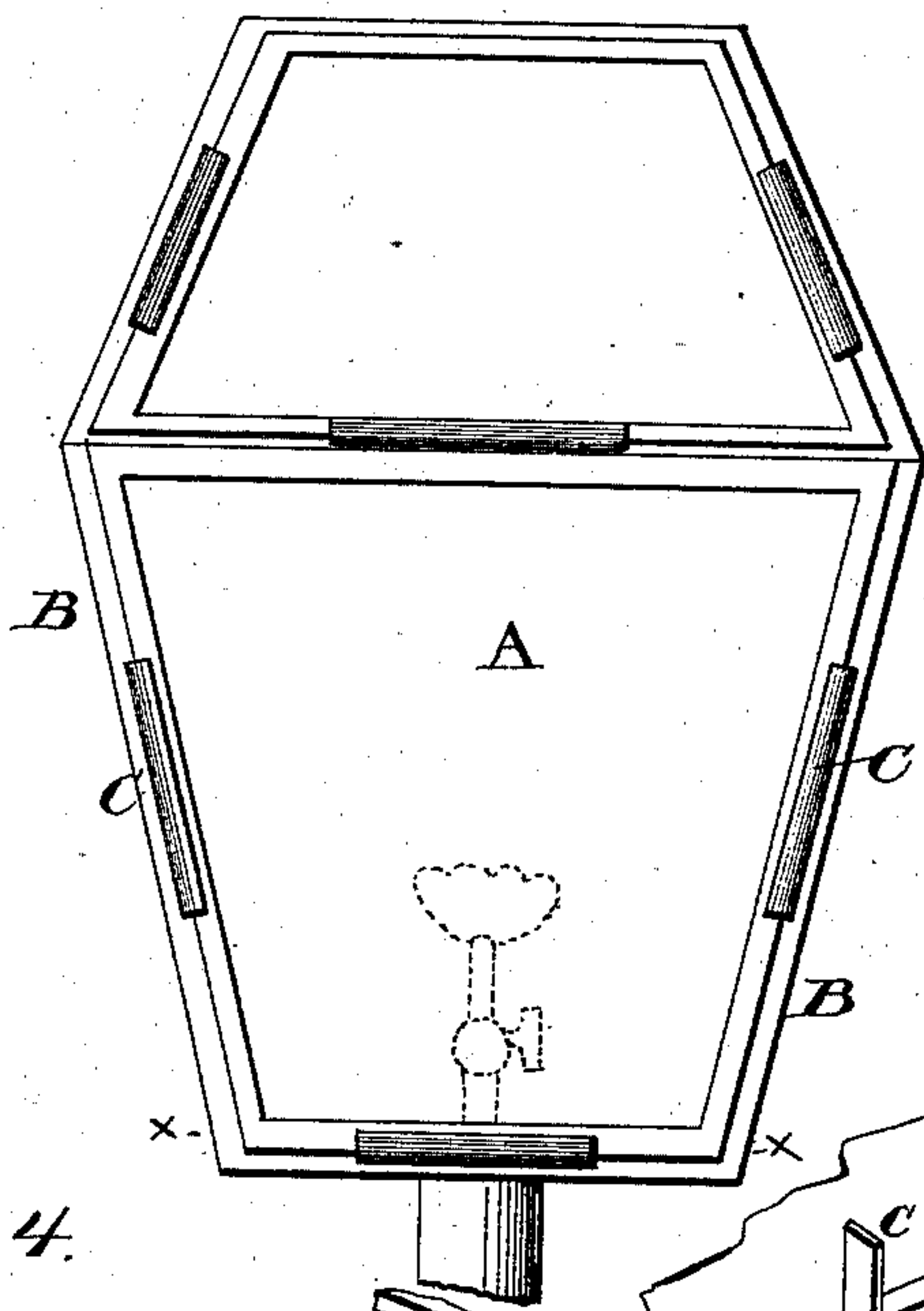

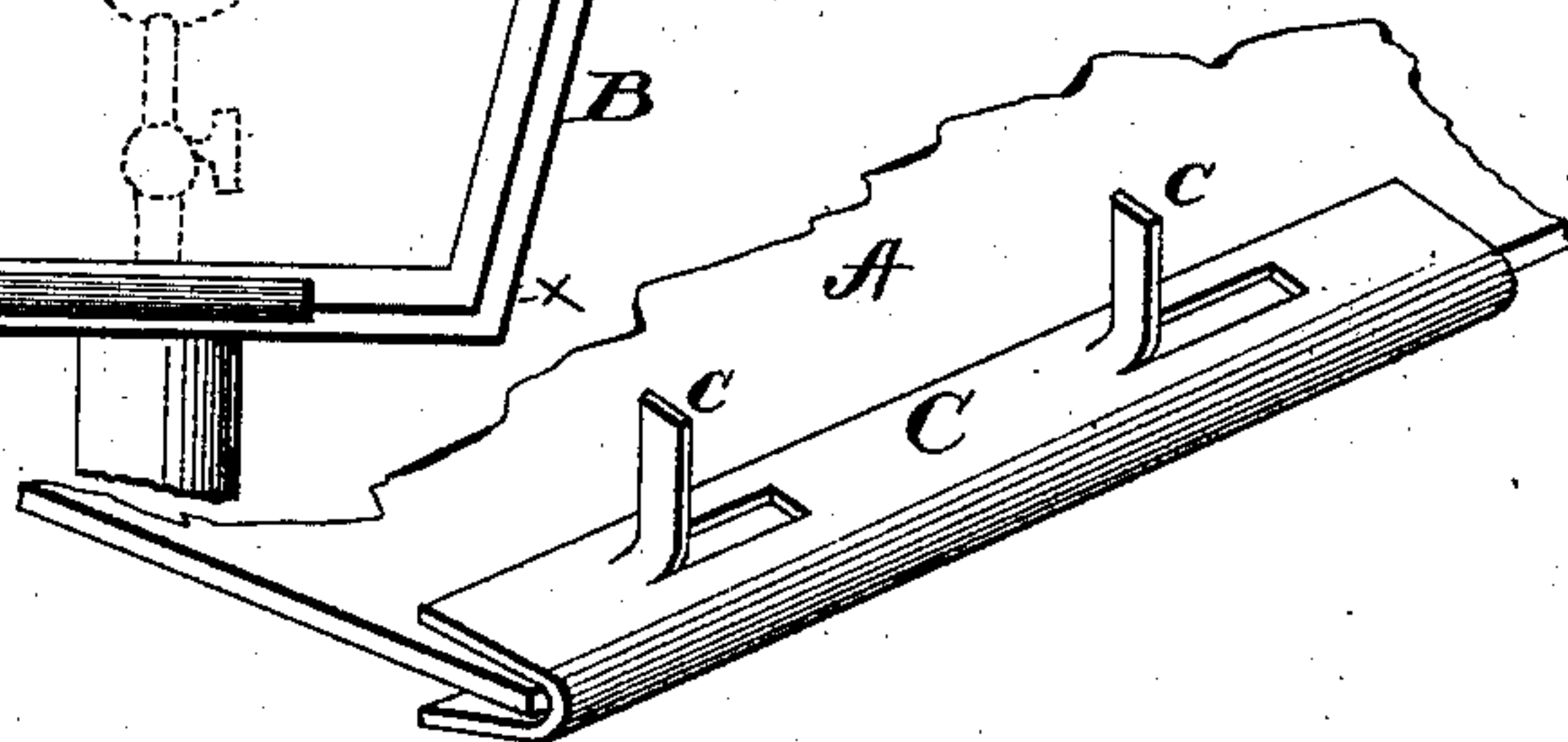

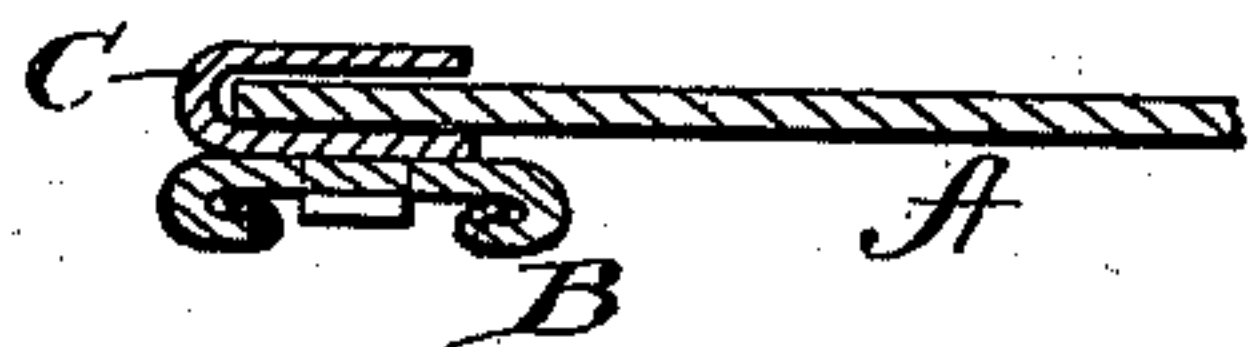

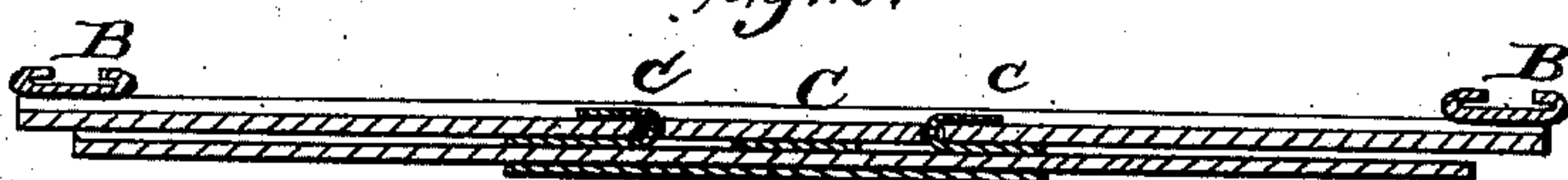
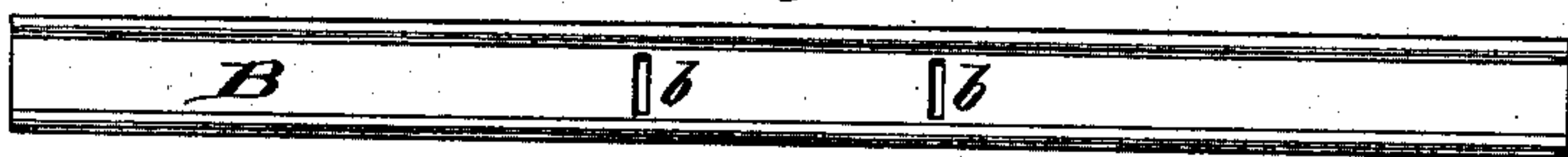

IMPROVEMENT IN ATTACHMENTS FOR STREET-LAMPS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **221,877**, dated November 18, 1879; application filed May 24, 1879.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE M. TAYLOR, of Annapolis, in the county of Anne Arundel, and in the State of Maryland, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Street-Lamp Attachments; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof.

My invention relates to street-lamps; and it consists in a detachable clamp for securing the panes of glass in the frame, as will hereinafter be more fully described.

In the drawings, Figure 1 represents one side of a street-lamp, the panes of which are secured in place by my clamp. Fig. 2 is a horizontal section of one side of a street-lamp on line *x x*, Fig. 1; Fig. 3, a perspective, and Fig. 4 a cross-section, of one of my clamps embracing the edge of a pane of glass. Fig. 5 represents one of the standards of a street-lamp slotted for the reception of my clamp.

A represents one of the panes, B the standards or corner-pieces, and C the clamp. This clamp is of U shape, and has tongues *c c* stamped out of one side of it, by which it is

attached to the standard or corner-piece by inserting the tongues in perforations *b b* and bending them down on the other side. With one of these clamps on each of the standards or corner-pieces, as well as upon the frame at the base of the lamp, the panes may be put in place and be held securely, while at any time they may be easily removed.

My improved clamp may also be easily removed, when desired, for repairs or renewal, and may be readily attached to any ordinary street-lamp frame after it has been slotted, as shown in Fig. 5.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A clamp for securing the glass in street-lamps, having tongues *c c* for attaching it to the frame, as set forth.
