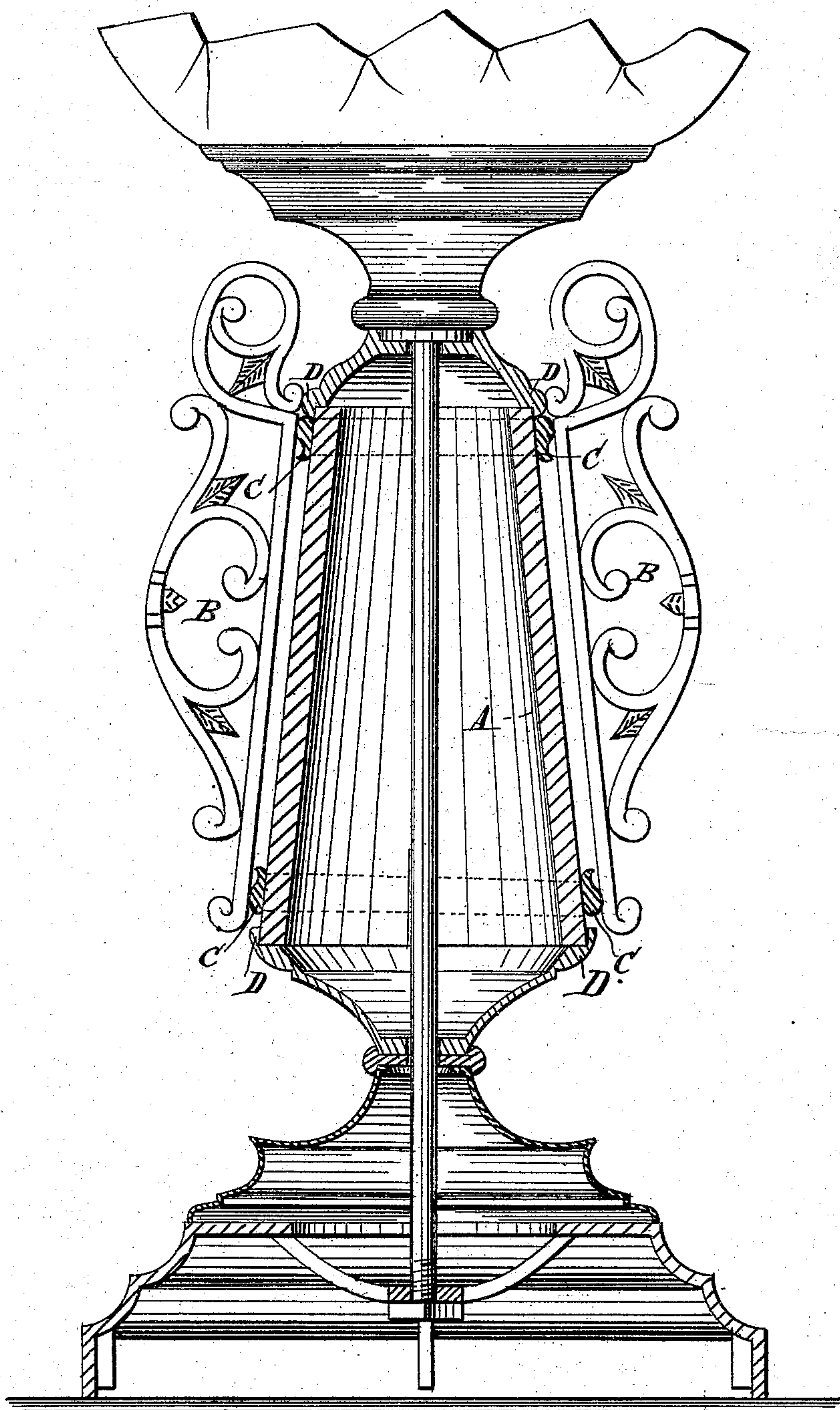

LAMP.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 224,701, dated February 17, 1880.

Application filed August 6, 1879.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH KINTZ, of West Meriden, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new and Improved Method of Fastening Ornaments or Handles to Lamps, of which the following is a specification.

The drawing represents a sectional elevation of a lamp with ornamental handle attached.

The object of this invention is to provide a simple and secure method of attaching ornaments or handles to glass, porcelain, metal, or other lamps; and the invention consists in so securing them by means of a ring or rings held in place by the trimmings on the lamp.

In the drawing, A represents the body of the lamp-base; B, the handles or ornaments; C, the rings, and D the trimmings or rims.

The handles or ornaments are first soldered or otherwise fastened to the rings, and the latter then fitted over the body of the lamp; or the ring or rings may be first set in place

and the ornaments or handles afterward attached.

In the drawing, the trimmings, rims, or flanges D hold the rings in place, preventing them from moving up or down; but in many cases it is found that other parts of a lamp's trimmings perform the same function, and in some instances it is found that one ring suffices to fasten the ornament or handle to the lamp instead of the two shown in the drawing.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

A lamp-base made of glass or porcelain, provided with two rings adapted to fit on the body of the base, and having two handles, each of which is attached to both of the rings, as shown and described.
