

BROOM AND BRUSH HOLDER.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 230,342, dated July 20, 1880.

Application filed March 10, 1880. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Josephus Hewitt Rosson, of Columbus, in the county of Hickman and State of Kentucky, have invented a new and Improved Broom and Brush Holder, of which the following is a specification.

The object of my invention is to provide a new and improved holder for hair, bristles, broom-straw, and like material for making brushes or brooms in a simple and convenient manner.

In the accompanying drawings, Figure 1 is a front elevation and partial section of a brush made with my improved holder. Fig. 2 is a cross-sectional elevation of the brush.

The metal bar A is provided with a screw, B, which projects upward from the narrow longitudinal side of the same, and is preferably in the center of this upper side. Upon this 20 bar A the strands C, of hair, bristles, broomcorn, rags, ropes, or any other suitable material of which the brush or broom is to be made, are hung in equal portions to each side of the screw B. The strands should be hung so that 25 an equal length hangs down at each side of the bar. The bar A, having the strands C suspended therefrom, is then inserted into a head, D, which may be made of wood, metal, or any other suitable material, in such a manner that 30 the screw passes through the aperture E in the top F of the head D, and also passes !

through the lower bent end, G, of the handle H, and is drawn tight by a thumb-screw or nut I.

The head, which has preferably the shape of 35 an inverted trough, may be straight or curved, and may be of any desired size, the bar A conforming in size and shape with the same.

J represents strips of iron so arranged in connection with the head D as to strengthen 40 said head, which is solid at its ends and closes on the broom to prevent its lateral displacement.

A brush or broom can be made very rapidly with my improved holder and at a much 45 smaller expense than that of brooms or brushes in use heretofore, and if the material of the brush or broom is worn out it can be easily replaced.

Having thus described my invention, what I 50 claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The combination, in a broom and brush holder, of the metal bar A, having screw to connect the parts together by nut I, the end 55 bent handle, H, the head D, having aperture E in top F, and the strips L, all substantially as shown and described.
